Derailment Ten cars vault track

MOUNT ALBERT — Train traffic on the C.N.R. line between North Bay and Toronto was disrupted this week when ten units of a 76-car freight were derailed at the Princess Street crossing in Mount Albert. The train, hauled by five diesel engines, was carrying iron ore to Hamilton and travelling at about 35 miles per hour when thirteen cars broke loose. Ten vaulted the track.

The impact ruptured a gas line in the area and it was feared an explosion might occur. It was learned later that the line was being tested with water and no gas was present. Clean-up crews were quickly dispatched to the site. C.N. officials declined to estimate the damage but police suggested one million dollars. A broken rail is blamed.

"The Golden Helmets" Ride at Fair

MARKHAM — The OPP Motorcycle Precision Riding Team, "The Golden Helmets" will be appearing again this year at the Markham Fair September 28 and 29. The Golden Helmets were originally formed in 1963. WATER RESTRICTIONS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

DUE TO THE EXCESSIVE DEMAND OF WATER IN THE STOUFFVILLE AREA IT IS NECESSARY TO ENFORCE THE FOLLOWING WATER RESTRICTIONS: The use of a hose for the watering of lawns is prohibited for the months of June, July, August and September with the following exceptions:

A. That part of the former Village of Stouffville lying west of the C.N.R. right-of-way may use a hose for watering lawns, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday between the hours of 8 A.M. to 9 A.M. and 7 P.M. to 8 P.M. ONLY

B. That part of the former Village of Stouffville lying east of the C.N.R. right-of-way may use a hose for watering lawns, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday between the hours of 8 A.M. to 9 A.M. and 7 P.M. to 8 P.M. ONLY

COUNCIL REQUESTS THAT RESIDENTS CONSERVE THE USE OF WATER TO AVOID THE NECESSITY OF FURTHER RESTRICTIONS BEING IMPLEMENTED.
