Your Aug. 31 editorial entitled "Bow and Arrow Barbarism", brought back memories of such an issue in the Twp. of Uxbridge a few years ago.

As you said, the council of that day took a dim view of that type of "sport", even though the applicant obviously put up a good argument.

And that's my point in writing. I can't recall what his argument was; what points were introduced to support his claim that shooting deer in that manner is not cruel. Perhaps a reply will be forthcoming from the Ministry of Natural Resources.

I personally am opposed to the killing of deer in any manner. I feel such hunts are totally unnecessary; that nature will take care of itself when an over-abundance of wildlife occurs in any

species. However, people wiser than I condone it, so the practice continues.

more quickly, thus less suffering for the victim. A deer, with an arrow in its side, could possibly run for miles or live for days before dying. If I remember correctly, this
