Notice of **PUBLIC MEETING**
on Tuesday, September 19th, 1978 at 8:00 p.m. In the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville

A public meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, as noted above, to present and discuss the following proposed OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT:

"Proposed Amendment No. 16 to the Official Plan of the Village of Stouffville, now in the Whitchurch-Stouffville planning area, which changes the land use designation from 'INDUSTRIAL' to 'COMMERCIAL' on part of BLOCK F, PLAN 569 (MAIN STREET WEST). The subject site consisting of approximately 6 679.5 square metres (1.7 acres) has a frontage of 61.0 metres (200 feet) on the north side of Main Street West immediately west of Patrick Motors, 477 Main Street West. The proposed amendment results from an application to permit a home centre which will sell hardware, appliances and furniture."

You are invited to attend the meeting and to state your support or objection to the proposed amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting. The amending document may be examined at the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville during regular business hours. (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.)
