Aid to widowed**

The local chapter of an international organization for young and middle-aged widowed man and women, will hold its first meeting, Oct. 15 at 2 p.m., in the Markham Baptist Church, 110 Church Street, Markham.

The Markham-Unionville Ministerial Association is heading formation of the THEOS Foundation here. It is a mutual selfhelp group, providing a non-denominational, educational, spiritual program for the widowed. Founded on the principle that widowed persons can com-

municate most sensitively with other widowed persons, THEOS offers to help individual through their immediate grief and also to cope with the day-to-day practical problems of widowhood. The name stands for "They Help Each Other Spiritually".

The organization was founded 15 years ago by Bea Deckel of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, after she was widowed and left with three young daughters. She established the group because there was no place for the widowed to turn for help and understanding. Participants in the

program receive a monthly magazine without charge. THEOS, in addition to monthly meetings, holds weekend conferences for the

OFFICES FOR WHICH PERSONS MAY BE NOMINATED

- 1 Mayor to be elected by general vote.
- 1 Regional Councillor to be elected by general vote.
- 1 Councillor to be elected by the electors of each of the five wards defined hereunder.
- 1 Member (Trustee) for the Durham Board of Education to be elected by general vote of the Public School Electors.

Electors are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly, and further take notice that the manner in which said nominations shall be filed is set forth in section 36 of The Municipal Elections Act. Nomination forms and full particulars of procedures to be followed, may be obtained from the undersigned.

If a greater number of candidates than required to fill the said offices are nominated and make the required declarations, notice of the time for the holding of the poll, including the advance poll and notice of the last day for making applications for a certificate to vote by proxy, will be given forthwith.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that where the number of candidates for an office who are nominated at the end of nomination day is not sufficient to fill the number of vacancies to which the candidates may be elected, on the Wednesday, following nomination day, **October 25, 1978**, the clerk, may, between the hours of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, receive and certify additional nominations for the office in respect of which there was an insufficient number of candidates.

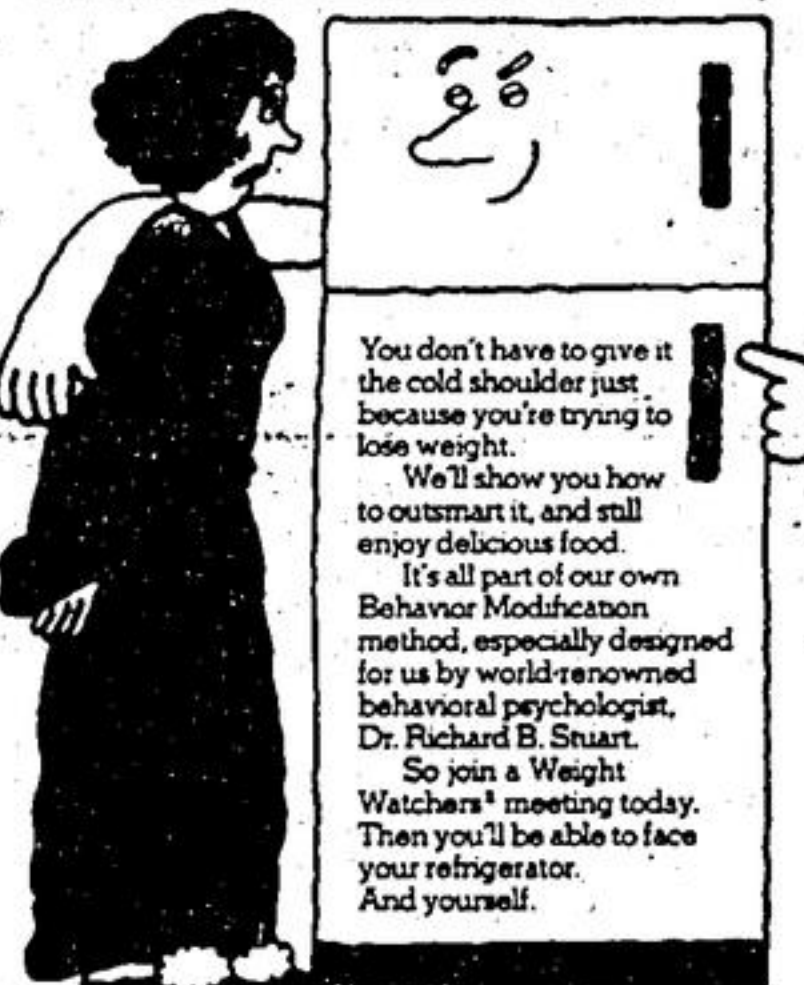
