The opening game for Stouffville's all star girls hockey team was a success, as the ladies knocked off Woodbridge, 3-2.

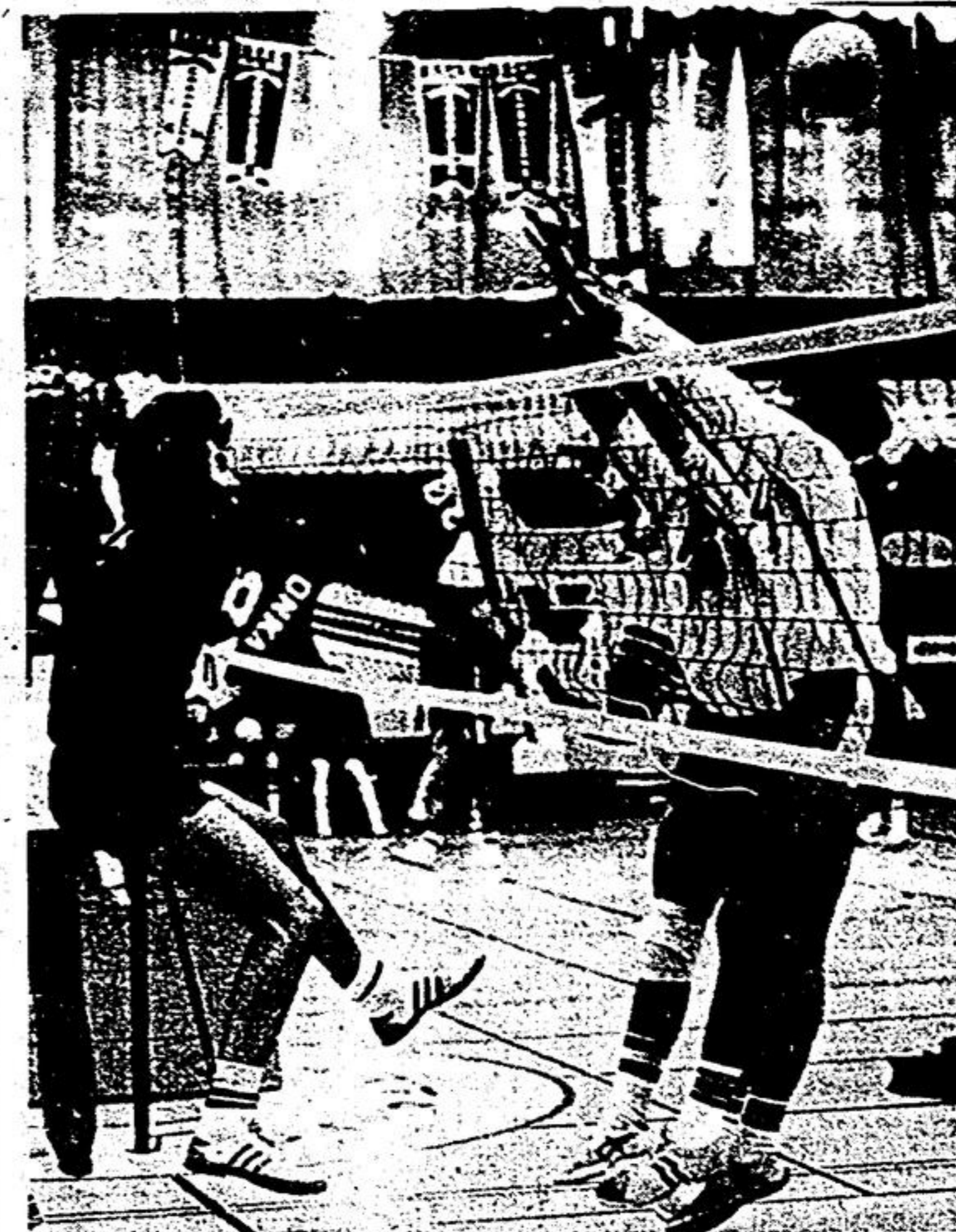
The game represented the first time Stouffville girls hockey has ventured outside the towns house league in regular league play.
