1976, there were 46,889 convictions in Ontario for driving while under the influence of alcohol. Alcohol was involved in a total of 89,190 offences of all kinds. At \$300 per person, the courts would have collected almost \$13 million in fines from drinking drivers alone. Vivien Smith-Hiltz has decided the courts

aren't going to get her share of that \$13 million nor will the government get any more of her money in the form of liquor taxes. She hasn't had a drink since the night she was stopped by police. She's become a member of a particular church group and now spends much of her time talking to others who are experiencing alcohol

problems. She denies she's a prohibitionist. She sees nothing wrong with people drinking reasonably. "My quarrel," she says, "is with a government that

doesn't care". During her 14 days in custody, she plans to put her feelings into words. She'll write letters to both provincial and federal members of parliament, stating her case, in a hope
