Doug Davidson and Ross Dube. Coach Ken Benson has done an outstanding job with the team this year.

In the senior division, it was Stouffville taking the County title for the 10th straight year.

Stouffville defeated St. Roberts, Langstaff, Huron Heights and Thornhill in regular play before knocking off Markham in the semi-finals. The final was against Langstaff, with Stouffville winning 15-7, 15-9.

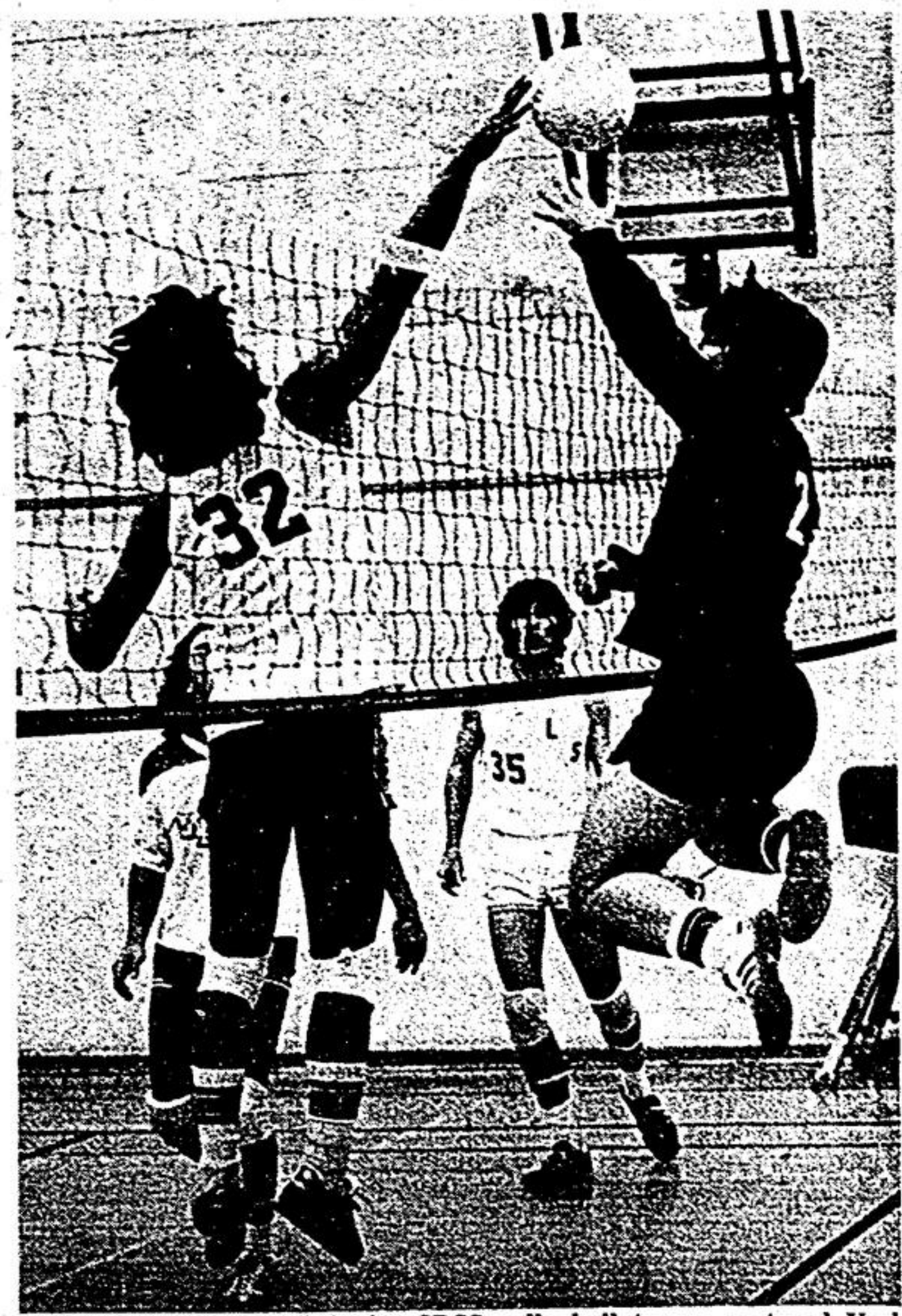
minutes remaining, spoiling the shut out for Jonathan Hall and Chad Redshaw.

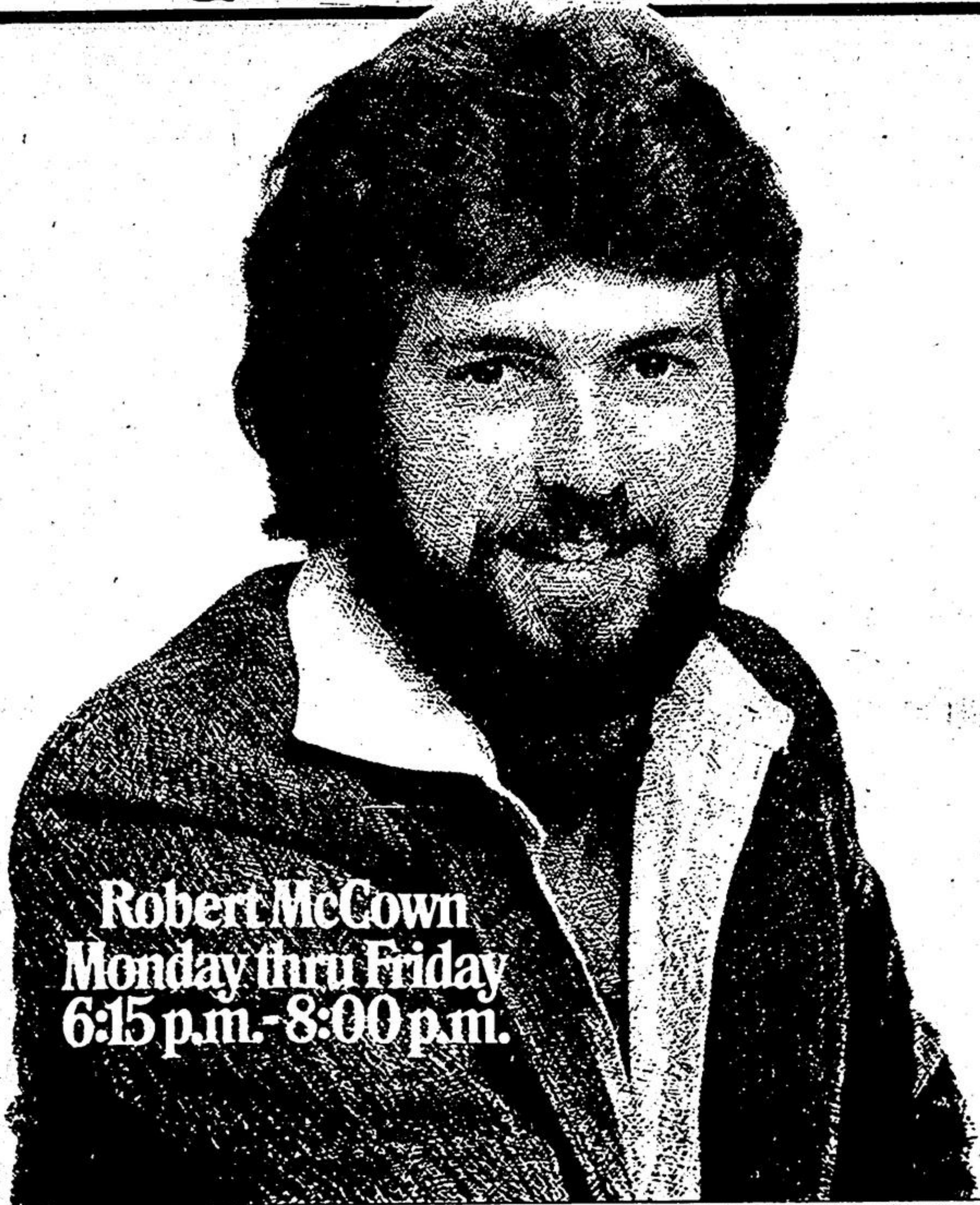
