NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF AN APPLICATION BY THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND DESCRIBED IN SCHEDULE 'A' HERETO IN THE TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE IN THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK FOR THE ELIMINATION OF THE JOG IN KENNEDY ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 3) AT ITS INTERSECTION WITH STOUFFVILLE ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 14) BY REALIGNING AND WIDENING KENNEDY ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 3) FROM A POINT APPROXIMATELY 3,600 FEET SOUTH OF ITS INTERSECTION WITH STOUFFVILLE ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 14) TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 1,500 FEET NORTH THEREOF TO A BASIC WIDTH OF 120 FEET WITH ADDITIONAL WIDENINGS AT CUTS, FILLS AND THE INTERSECTION WITH STOUFFVILLE ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 14); THE WIDENING OF KENNEDY ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 3) FROM A POINT APPROXIMATELY 1,500 FEET NORTH OF STOUFFVILLE ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 14) TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 4,200 FEET NORTH THEREOF TO A BASIC WIDTH OF 120 FEET WITH ADDITIONAL WIDENINGS AT CUTS AND FILLS; AND THE WIDENING OF STOUFFVILLE ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 14) FROM A POINT APPROXIMATELY 1,200 FEET WEST OF ITS MOST EASTERLY INTERSECTION WITH KENNEDY ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 3) TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 500 FEET EAST THEREOF TO A BASIC WIDTH OF 100 FEET WITH ADDITIONAL WIDENINGS AT CUTS, FILLS AND THE INTERSECTION WITH THE PROPOSED REALIGNED KENNEDY ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD NO. 3).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in 'Schedule A' hereto. Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

(a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;

(b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:
1. The Expropriations Act provides that,

(a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) The inquiry officer,

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.

Late Stan Burkholder Veterans pay their respects

STOUFFVILLE — Thirty veterans, all members of Stouffville Branch 459 of the Royal Canadian Legion, formed an honor guard outside the O'Neill Funeral Home following the service, Sunday, for the late Stanley Burkholder.

Mr. Burkholder, Legion President from 1964 through 1967, passed away Nov. 10 in Scarborough Centenary Hospital. "He fought failing health with the

courage of a true soldier," said branch padre, Rev. Jim Carder.

Each Legion member placed a poppy atop the flag-draped casket as friends of the deceased stood in silent tribute. This portion of the service was in charge of veteran Rae McFadden. Pall bearers were — Ivan Goudie, Fred Castle, Grant Turner, Bernie Tunney, Donald Hodgins and Rae McFadden. Interment was at Dickson's Hill Cemetery.

Activities within the Legion here were important to Stan Burkholder. He was a regular participant in Remembrance Day parades and had the honor of serving as Branch President during Canada's centennial. He gave the position the distinction it deserved.

Born at Glasgow, east of Stouffville, the son of Orvel and Mae (Drewery) Burkholder, he spent 20 years in the Toronto Police Department. During World War II, he assisted with the training of troops at Camp Borden. He held the rank of Warrant Officer. Later, he was employed as a department manager at Simpson's.

For a period of 2½ years, he lived at Fenelon Falls but always called Stouffville 'home'. He was a member of Spry Masonic Lodge in Fenelon Falls.

Surviving besides his wife, the former Mabel Huard, is his stepmother, Marguerite Burkholder; one son, Keith of Thornhill; grandsons, Peter, Paul and Glenn and one great granddaughter, Theresa, "the pride of his life". Two sisters, June (Mrs. Stuart Belamy) and Norrine also survive.

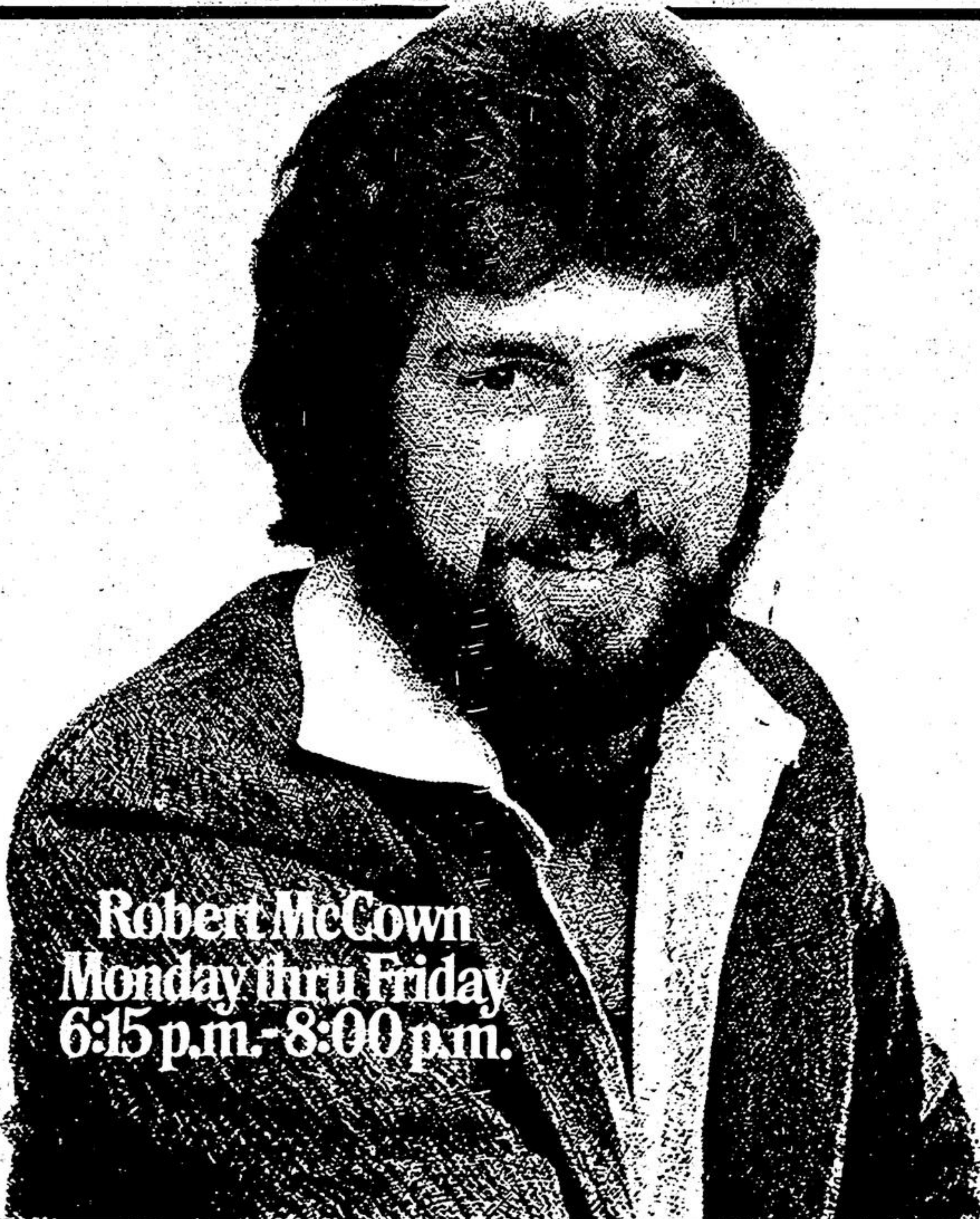
Turkey Shoot
