

Two defeats for Pee wee B's

Although Stouffville continued to test the Bay goalie with two breakaways and

numerous shots, the final period proved to be the clincher for Bay. They were able to pop in three more goals for their win.

Undaunted by that defeat, the Pee wees came up strong in an exhibition match against Unionville a few days later, winning the game 4-2.

Halfway through the first period, Joe Donnelly opened the Stouffville scoring, assisted by Chris

Doyle. The B's goalie, Tim MacEwen, made numerous key saves, the best of which was a clear cut Unionville breakaway.

The period ended with Stouffville's second goal, coming from Danny O'Hare with Shawn Leonard and Steve Altilla assisting.

The score stayed that way until early in the third when Unionville's

Steve McDowell took advantage of a rebound and broke Tim's shut out. Only two minutes later Daryl Allen tied it up on a breakaway.

The B's didn't get discouraged and only a few minutes later Stouffville, playing short handed, took the lead with a goal by Chris Doyle, nicely set up by Ken Burrows. Stouffville's insurance goal was provided by Craig Vaughan, assisted by Don Brooks.
