

Clippers losses stopped

The Stouffville Clippers have finally broken their long losing string, taking a 7-7 tie against Lindsay last Saturday night. The game was marred by an incredible 130 total minutes in penalties, 90 minutes assessed to Lindsay. Because of the penalties

the game turned into a marathon match, lasting three hours and 20 minutes. Three Lindsay players were given game misconducts and in the second period alone Lindsay took 56 minutes.

The game started with Lindsay taking a 2-0 lead before running into their first batch of penalties. The Clippers were able to tie it up at the end of the first on goals by Owen Heise from Steve Schell and 30 seconds later Mike Kloepper scored from Owen Heise.

In the second Glen Gibson on an unassisted power play goal and Dave Dart, also unassisted, gave Stouffville a 4-2 lead. However Lindsay

got one back on a short handed effort. The final period saw Lindsay tie it up at the 30 second mark, but then the Clippers responded for three straight goals and what looked like a victory. Goalscorers were Jamie McKay, John Turner and Glen Gibson, with assists going to Mike Kloepper, Steve Spang,

Howie Jones and John Turner.

Not to be outdone, the Lindsay team scored three straight of their own, the final tying goal coming at the 17 minute mark.

Two days before the Lindsay game the Clippers travelled to Beaverton and in a familiar story lost 7-4.

Win for Bears

The Neil Patrick Polar Bears clashed with Lindsay on Monday night in town and came up winners, 1-0.

The lone goal of the game came on a good passing play with Mark

Goldring knocking the puck behind the net. Blair Steel made a sharp centering pass to Kirk Smythe who put a well placed shot behind the goalie for the Novice's win.

NOTES:
1. The Expropriations Act provides that,

(a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) The inquiry officer,

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
