WHITCHURCH - A Morgan quarter horse called "Indian Red" has taken up residence in Whitchurch-Stouffville. The Town feels honored to be chosen as his home. For "Indian Red" is no ordinary horse. He's a member of the Purina Animal Hall of Fame, the first of his kind to be named to this place of distinction. It all came about on a day last December. "Indian Red" and his rider, 18 year old Helen Bumbly, were travelling along Kennedy Road near Cashel. Suddenly, the horse stopped short, began whinnying and pawing the ground. Helen recalled. She couldn't see what was bothering him, so dismounted to have a look around. To her amazement, she discovered a 77 year old woman almost completely buried in deep snow. The victim, weak but conscious, was too heavy for Helen to lift. However, a snowplow happened by and the operator agreed to stay while she went to a nearby house to call an ambulance. Once in hospital, the woman soon recovered. "Indian Red", thought to be 25 years old, now resides at Aintree.
