NOTES:
 1. The Expropriations Act provides that,

(a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) The inquiry officer,

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.

Learning Disability Centre Official opening

The York Centre For Learning Disabilities held its Official Opening Nov. 23 at Leslie Street, Richmond Hill.

Participating in the ceremony were - Dr. Anne Berens, representing the Ministry of Community and Social Services; Paul Maich, chairman of the Centre's Board of Directors; and Craig Shields, Executive Director.

The Opening marked the end of a nearly three year process to acquire a new home for the Centre for children with learning disabilities.

It also celebrated the results of a highly successful fund-raising drive to raise funds for renovation of the building, a vacated school which had been used for book storage.

"We are extremely pleased and gratified by the community's overwhelming support," Mr. Shields said.

"Last year at this time we were uncertain about our ability to raise the necessary in the time allotted."

But with the support of dozens of service clubs throughout the Region, plus the contributions of hundreds of individuals, the Centre not only met its goal, but went over its target by nearly \$20,000.

"The extra money has allowed us to put back into the plans, items originally left out to keep costs at a minimum," Mr. Shields explained.

The York Centre serves children from communities throughout the Regional Municipality of York, including - Woodbridge, Thornhill, Markham, Unionville, Richmond Hill, King City, Schomberg, Stouffville, Ballantrae, Aurora, Newmarket and Sharon.
