Local fair-goers will vouch for this. Her name is synonymous with red ribbons at every competition.

Ruby says she was never really "taught" to bake or preserve. "I just

read up on the subject," she recalls.

By her own admission, she spends a lot of time in the kitchen—and enjoys it. She says its pretty chaotic a day or two before she places her exhibits on display. "There's hardly room for the family," she jokes. She's up at 6 a.m. and refuses to quit until she's through.

Ruby Johnson's been toiling over a bakeboard nineteen years now. However, competitively, it's been about four years. She submitted her first entries at a fair in Goodwood.

At Markham Fair this year, she won the Domestic Science Championship for a second time in succession plus the Brooke Bond Special Award. She's attained the same distinction at Uxbridge three years in a row.
