## Spot Checks

# Eleven charged

YORK REGION — Up to Christmas Day, more than 6,500 motorists had been stopped in Spot Checks of drivers and their vehicles across York Region.

Deputy Police Chief Robert Hood reported this week. Only 11 impaired driving charges had been laid, the deputy-chief said. However, 1,400 warnings were issued concerning seatbelts, licences, and faulty equipment.

The program began Dec. 4 and will continue into 1979. No date has been set for its conclusion.

Spot checks are undertaken in the interests of promoting safe driving and preventing

accidents, explained Hood. They are an ongoing activity, carried out at the discretion of individual officers during the remainder of the year.

Mr. Hood says he's satisfied with the results, claiming the number of impaired offences has continued to drop since the project was first introduced.

An impaired driving conviction normally carries a fine of from \$100 to \$150 with a three month licence suspension. Rather than take the risk, deputy chief Hood advises taking a taxi. "The cost is quite reasonable compared to the consequences," he concluded.
