

Dies in Lindsay hospital

STOUFFVILLE — Arthur Clarkson, well-known in the Stouffville area, passed away, Jan. 17, at Ross Memorial Hospital, Lindsay where he'd been a patient after suffering a stroke a few days before. He was 82.

Born in Bloomington, an only child of William and Louisa Clarkson, he obtained his elementary education at Glasgow Public School. Later, he trained as a stationary engineer and held a membership in the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers from 1940-45.

After leaving the Altona community, he resided at Lindsay and later with a daughter, Ruth (Mrs. Carman Fligg) at Cannington. Besides his wife, the former Eliza Jane Smith, others in the family include daughters, Rose (Mrs. George Taylor) in Nova Scotia; Frances (Mrs. Erwin Martins) of British Columbia; Phyllis (Mrs. Wm. Juniper) of Brampton and two sons, Stan and Robert, both of Stouffville. There are 23 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Service was held Jan. 19 from the O'Neill Funeral Home, Stouffville with interment, Stouffville Cemetery.

Aware of rates

STOUFFVILLE — The public may not have been fully aware of a pending phone rate hike but Town Council was, Mayor Eldred King told The Tribune this week.

The mayor said he vigorously opposed it at the time and still does. The issue was the subject of considerable debate, he stated.

Former Metro residents, now living in Whitchurch-Stouffville, were the ones most anxious to be included in a free-call area with Toronto, Mayor King noted. And while successful in obtaining this service, he doesn't share their ecstasy.

"They moved out here, well aware of the situation," he said, pointing out that the individuals being hurt are the elderly or fixed incomes who wouldn't make more than one call to the city in a month. "All of a sudden they get thumped," he concluded.

Station eyesore

STOUFFVILLE — Mayor Eldred King doesn't disagree with a Tribune editorial (Jan. 11), saying the old C.N.R. station should have been saved. He feels, however, that it could not have been made into a museum, since the Town is already committed to one and one is all the municipality can afford.

Mayor King admits the station, in its present state of disrepair, is nothing but an eyesore. He intends to contact the railroad to find out what's to be done about it.

King claims a museum is one project that doesn't necessarily have to be located in a centre of population. Besides, he says, the rural areas deserve some consideration.

Still, he wonders if perhaps the Town didn't make a mistake by not exerting more pressure on C.N. to preserve the structure, in the light of their decision to remodel the one at Unionville and the fact "two little shacks" were erected next to the depot already there.

Draft approval

MUSS: LAKE Whitchurch-Stouffville Council has given draft approval for a nineteen lot subdivision on Connor Drive, near the Musselman's Lake Road.

The developer of the 30,000 square foot lots is Ontario, Ltd., and local builder Michael Wade. Council noted Mr. Wade had worked long and hard to produce a plan satisfactory to the town and the Connor Drive residents.

Final approval from the Ontario Municipal Board must now be granted.
