

She (There's an incriminating gender.) has a crock-pot stomach and a souffle determination that collapses everytime it's exposed to the hot-bread air from the bakery next door. We suspect that, over there in the Stouffville Bakery. close to the ovens, a giant bellows puffs out whiffs of freshbaked aroma whenever we walk irresolutely past the store.

Resolute shoppers, more

interested in best buys in bulbs and bathtubs than bakery buns, would be well advised to check our consumer through magazines first. We carry three - all published monthly. The two from the States, Consumer Reports and Consumers' Research Magazine, also compile annual reviews. The third, Canadian Consumer, is published by the Consumers' Association of Canada. All claim that their evaluations, based on price, quality and performance, are unbiased. They scrutinize a surprising variety of items. The current issues, for instance, provide information

comparisons on fire extinguishers, cross-country skis, snow shovels, hockey sticks, pocket knives, blue jeans, slow cookers, refrig-freezers and dried soup mixes. Back issues of all our magazines may be taken out on loan.

Other education-related material in this same reference area includes: information on government funding, evening and summer courses, and programmes abroad. There are also two hefty volumes listing careers in Ontario, the qualifications required and job opportunities.
