

# Judo gold medal

STOUFFVILLE — Winning trophies and medals is nothing new to 16 year old Steven Sheffield, but this week Steven surpassed himself when he brought home a 'Gold' in the Judo event, in the Canada Winter Games held at Brandon Manitoba.

Competing in the under 65 Kilo class, for 15 to 17 year olds, Steven fought four preliminary bouts against entries from Nova Scotia,

Manitoba, Quebec and British Columbia. Although none of his preliminary wins were 'walk-overs' he thought his final bout was the toughest one of all. Asked if he had any doubts about pulling off the big one he replies "No, I felt that providing I was not unlucky in any way I could win the gold." Steven was the only member of Ontario Judo team to win a gold. His next goal is to qualify for the Senior

Canadian event to be held in Quebec City in May. Winners in this event will be chosen to represent Canada in the next Olympics, to be held in Russia in 1980. Steven is not too worried as to whether he can qualify this year, as he says "I still have a long way to go and have many years ahead of me to get ready for International competition." At sixteen he certainly has a very bright future.
