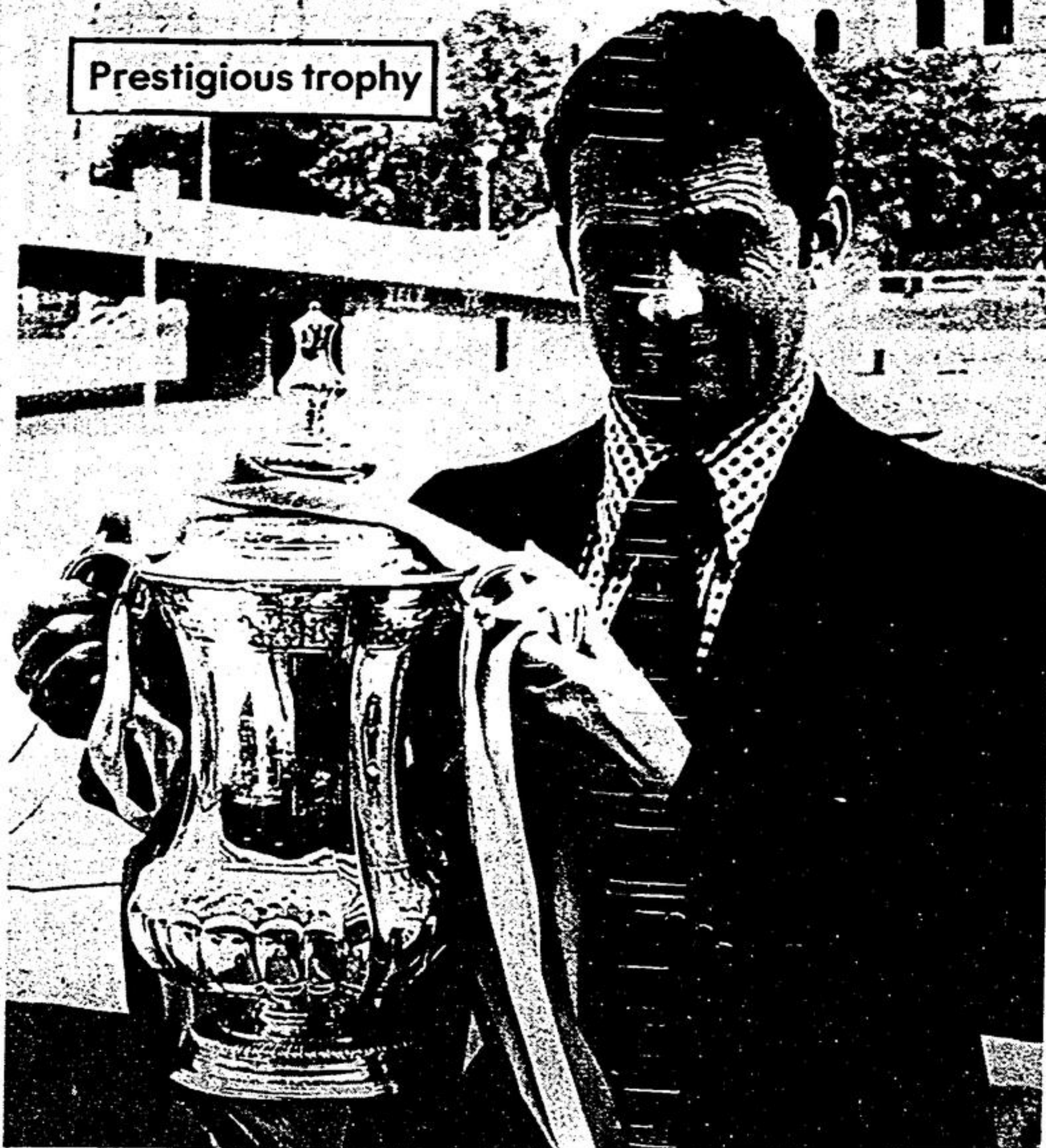

7TH LINE, McCOWAN Road (Regional Road No. 67)

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

The widening of 7th Line, McCowan Road (Regional Road No. 67) in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville from Bloomington Road (Regional Road No. 40) to a point approximately 2300 feet south thereof to a basic width of 100 feet with additional widening at cuts and fills; the clearing, grubbing, fencing and grading, gravelling and paving thereof to provide a basic two lane roadway together with the construction of culverts, drainage works and all related works and undertakings and the acquisition of the necessary lands and interests in lands.

The Engineering Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 2:00 p.m. on the 13th of March, 1979 at the Engineering Building on the west side of Woodbine Avenue one and one-quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear in person or by his counsel, solicitor or agent, any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard.
