# WANT TO VOTE MAY 22nd?

THEN YOUR NAME MUST BE ON THE NEW LIST OF VOTERS!

**LIVE IN AN URBAN AREA?**

Sometime this week, (Monday to Saturday), two people will call at your home and identify themselves as official federal ENUMERATORS. It is their job to compile the new list of eligible voters in your Polling Division. They will ask the names of all persons living in your home, who are Canadian citizens, age 18 years and over and will give you an Enumeration Record (Form 301) for each one. Form 301 should be kept until Election Day.

**CHECK THE VOTERS' LIST!**

You'll have 2 chances to do this —


- (1) Within the next 10 days the new list of voters will be posted in both Urban and Rural Polling Divisions. Check that your name is on the list and spelled correctly.
- (2) Four weeks from now, if you live in an Urban area, you will receive a printed copy of the voters' list for your Polling Division, in the mail. Check again that your name is on the list — correctly!

**NOT ON THE LIST?**

REMEMBER — if your name is not on the list, you will not be able to vote if you live in an URBAN Polling Division. In a RURAL Polling Division, you can be "vouched" for by a friend or neighbour on Election Day if that person is on the Voters' List for your area.

**LIVE IN A RURAL AREA?**

One Enumerator, probably someone from your neighbourhood, prepares the new list of voters. That person doesn't have to call at your home personally, since the information needed can be obtained from other reliable sources.
