Trailing 6-2 and with only 11 minutes left in the game, Mike Howard gave Stouffville their number three with a shot that barely succeeded in trickling over the line.

With the game ending 6-3, hopes of a Sunday win faded fast.

Despite their previous days loss Stouffville played a much better game on the Sunday. Unfortunately they came up against a red-hot Petrolia team that continued to forecheck and keep the play in Stouffville's end. Again Stouffville had

great difficulty in breaking out and setting up a play.

The final score of 7-3 was evidence enough to show that Petrolia is the toughest opposition yet in the series.

Outstanding performance of the day came from John Carrick, who put in a superhuman performance during the second and third periods, with well saved glove shots and coping with innumerable screened shots coming at him from all directions.

It was McKenzie, Bartley and Greenshields who gave Stouffville their three goals.

A mention must be made of the fantastic support given by the Stouffville fans who travelled such a long distance, in such large numbers, to support their team.
