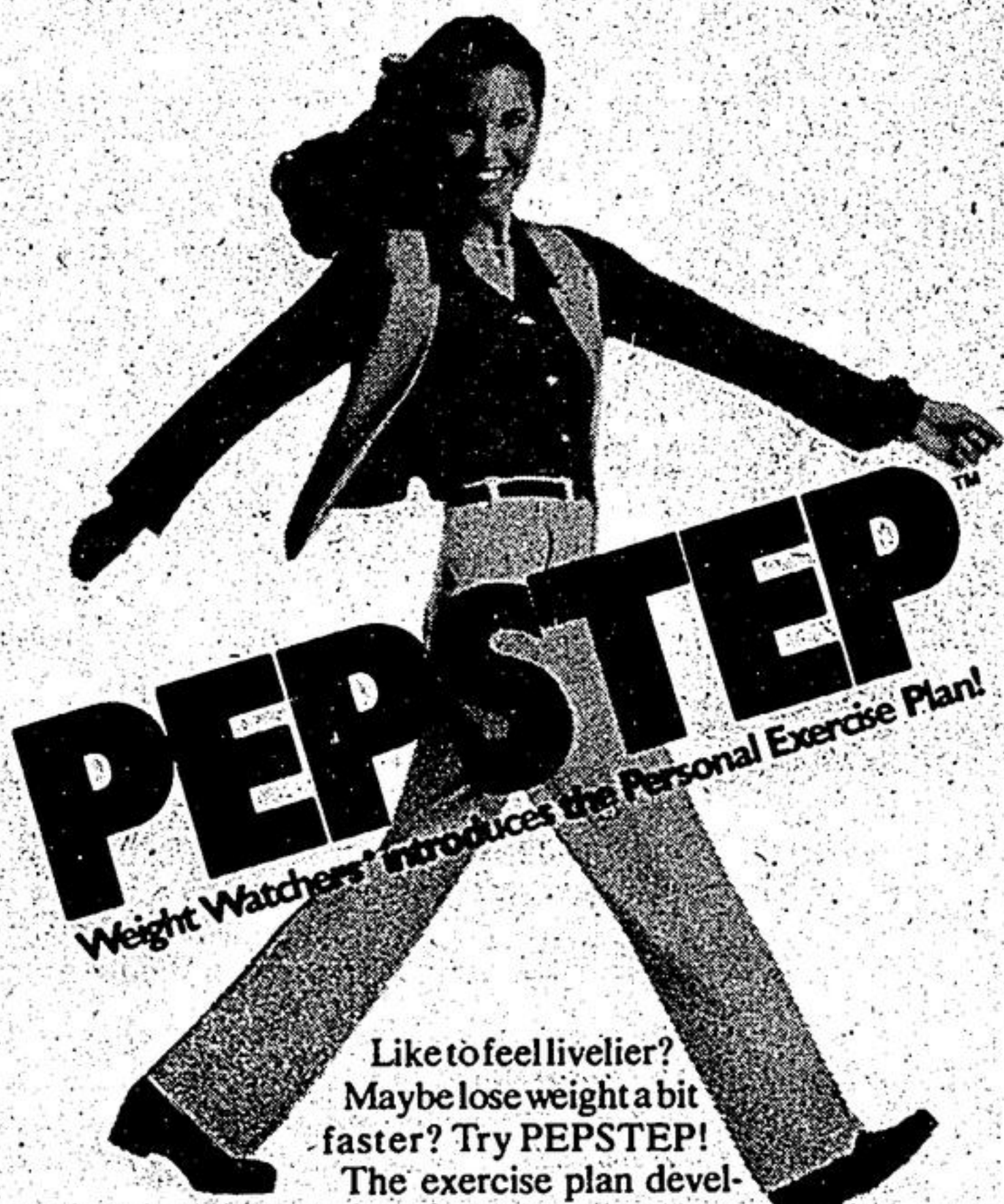

THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK WOODBINE AVENUE (Regional Road No. 8)

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

THE WIDENING OF Regional Road No. 8 (Woodbine Avenue) from a point approximately 1000 feet south of Slater Road in the Community of Vandorf in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, to a point approximately 1000 feet north of Slater Road to a basic width of 120 feet with additional widening at the intersection of Slater Road and Regional Road No. 8 (Woodbine Avenue); the site preparation, grading, graveling and paving thereof to provide a basic two lane roadway with additional turning lanes at the intersections of Regional Road No. 8 (Woodbine Avenue) and Slater Road and Executive Drive, together with the construction of culverts, storm sewers, concrete curbs and gutters, drainage works and all other related necessary lands and interests in lands.

The Engineering Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 2:00 p.m. on the 5th of June, 1979 at the Engineering Building on the west side of Woodbine Avenue one and one quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard should so advise the office of the Regional Clerk (Tel: 895-1231 extension 35) 48 hours prior to the meeting.

Plans showing the above proposed work may be seen at the office of Ronald Gee, Planning and Design Engineer, at the Engineering Building (Tel: 895-2303).
