Robert Fitzgibbon of World Vision will be the guest speaker at 7:30 p.m., Sunday, April 29 in the Missionary Church.

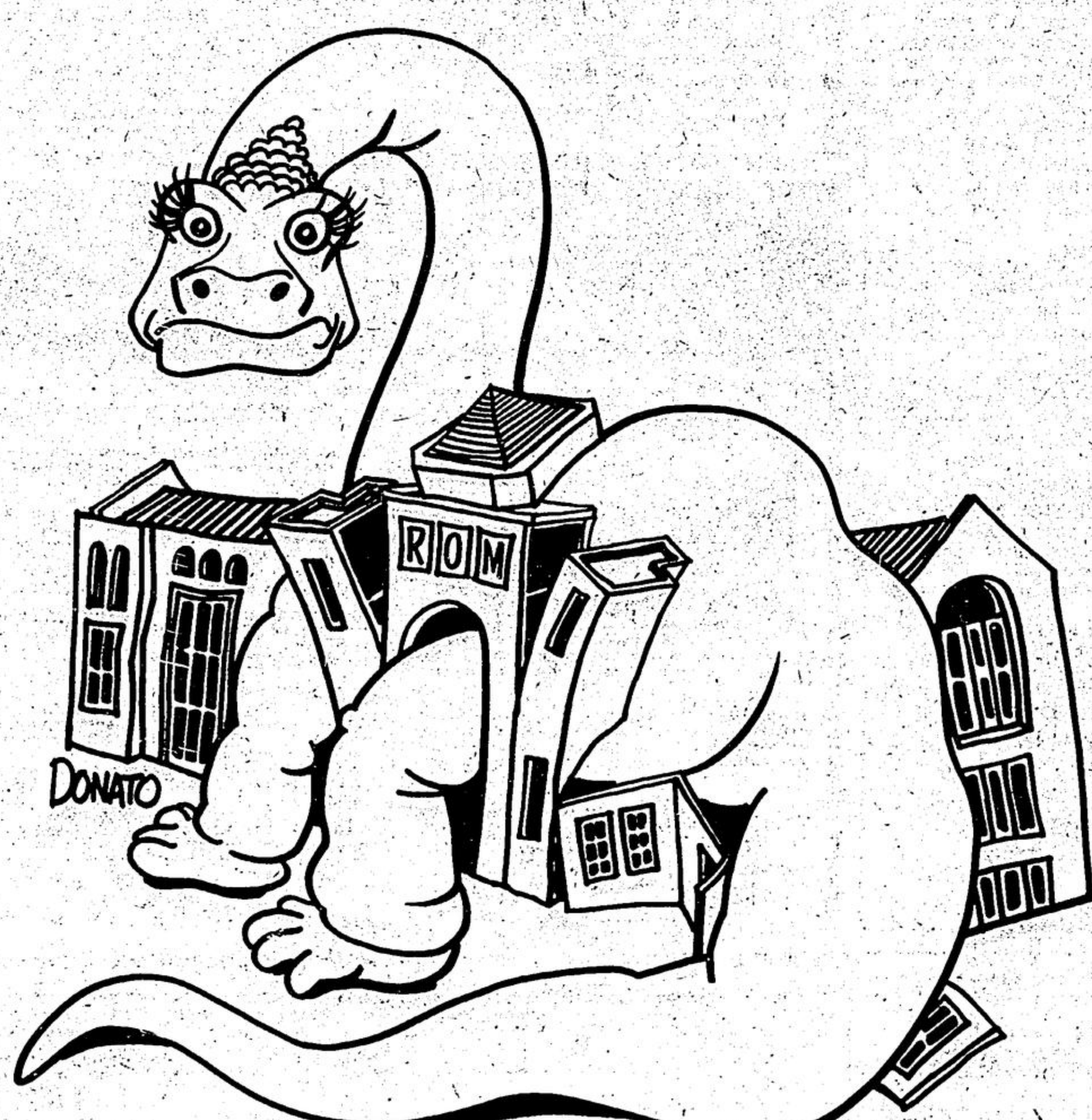

(Regional Road No. 67)

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

the widening of Regional Road No. 67 (7th Line, McCowan Road) in the Towns of Markham and Whitchurch-Stouffville from a point approximately 600 feet south of the more southerly intersection of 16th Avenue and Regional Road No. 67 (7th Line, McCowan Road) in the Town of Markham to a point approximately 2000 feet south of Regional Road No. 14 (Stouffville Road) in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville to a basic width of 100 feet with additional widenings at cuts, fills and intersections; the clearing, grubbing, fencing, grading, gravelling and paving thereof to provide a basic two lane roadway with additional turning lanes at intersections, together with the construction of culverts, drainage works, including stream realignments, and all other related works and undertakings, and the acquisition of the necessary lands and interests in lands.

The Engineering Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 1:00 p.m. on the 15th of May, 1979 at the Engineering Building on the west side of Woodbine Avenue one and one-quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard.

Plans showing the above proposed work may be seen at the office of Ronald Gee, Planning and Design Engineer, at the Engineering Building (Tel: 364-8731).

An Information Centre will be held at the Markham Fairgrounds from 2:00 to 5:30 p.m. and from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, the 1st of May.

Staff of the Regional Engineering Department and the consulting engineers will be on hand to show plans and answer questions concerning the proposed work.
