STOUFFVILLE — coming from an illegal pitch call. Stouffville's junior softball team got away to a good start in winning their first two games of the season.

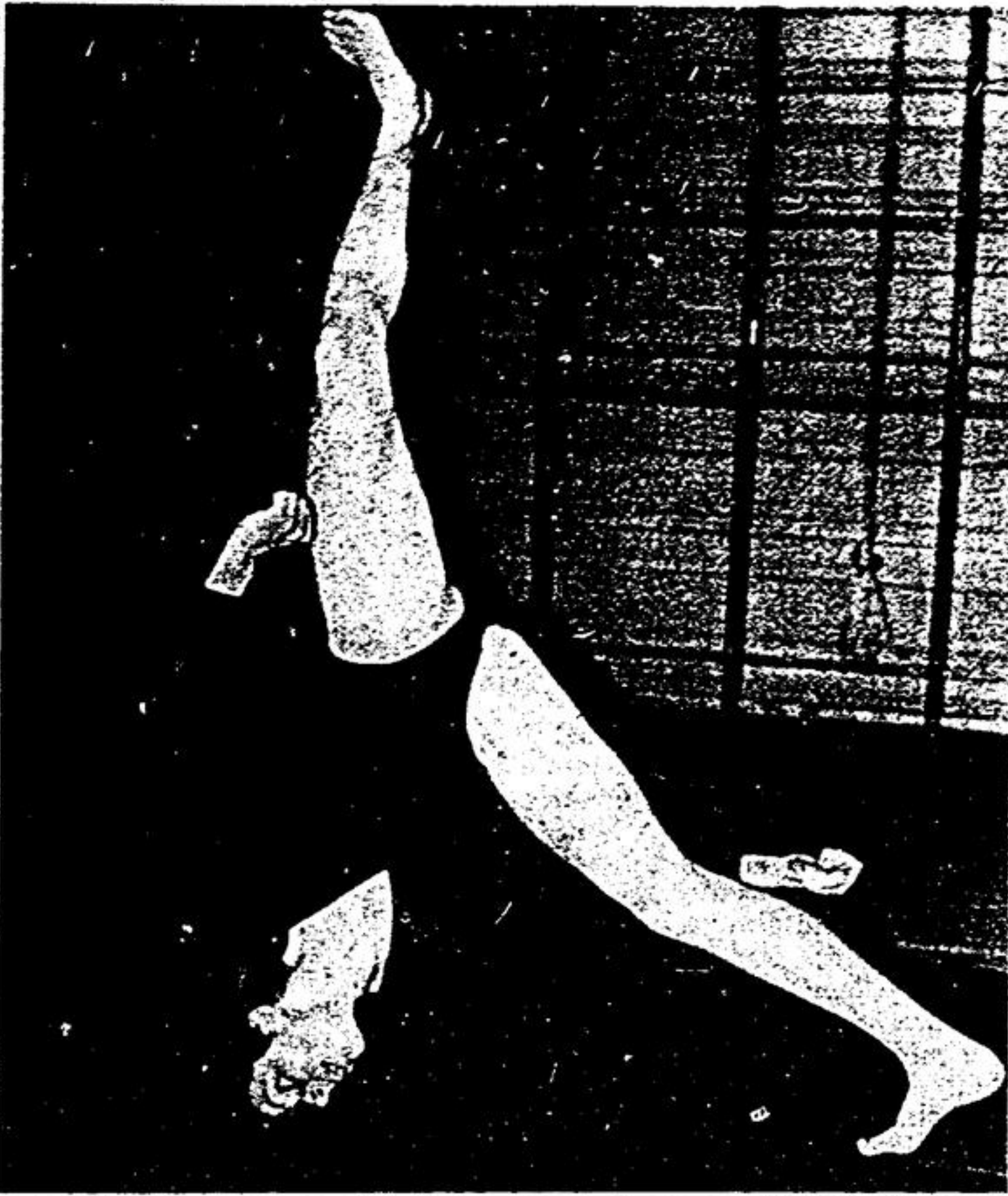
