STOUFFVILLE — Although Stouffville failed to make the semi-finals in last week-end's Squirt soccer tournament at least they had the satisfaction of putting on an excellent and exceedingly well run tournament. Notwithstanding last minute "non-shows" by two or three teams, the two day operation went like clockwork.

Both Stouffville teams were eliminated early in the contest, with George Ross Photo bowing 3-0 to Port Perry and then losing 4-0 to eventual champions Baugh Construction of Oakville.

The Hillsburg team did not put in an appearance against their Fawns Sports opponents who were given a "bye". The Fawns' team went down later in the day to a narrow 2-1 loss against Newmarket.

Of the two semi-finals games the most exciting one was the match between Thornhill and Port Perry, in which Thornhill just and only just managed to squeak a 2-1 win over, very competent opposition.

The second semi-final between Newmarket and Oakville showed the power and dominance of

the Oakville team, which was apparent throughout the tournament. They made no mistake in this game in which they steamrollered over the opposition to a 4-0 win.

Without a doubt, the final game of the day - for the championship - was a cliffhanger. It took over two hours to decide the eventual outcome. Not only was the standard of play exceedingly high, but the teams were very well matched.

Fifteen minutes into the first half Thornhill collected their first goal. It looked as if they were heading for a one goal lead at half time, when a fine breakaway by Oakville evened the score, practically on the whistle.

Into the second half it was again Thornhill who scored first and it looked like Oakville for the runners-up trophy when they put on a supreme effort and tied the game 2-2.

Despite an additional ten minutes each way, to try and break the tie, it was obvious that both teams were determined to become champions and overtime ended with yet another tie.

The final outcome was dependent on five penalty kicks apiece, and even this did not decide

the winner. It was not until the seventh attempt that the game went to Oakville on a 2-1 penalty kick; not the best way to end a super week end of soccer, but then all of us had to go home sometime. I am convinced the teams would rather have played on until exhaustion had set in.

At the presentation of awards Martin Johannessen, Chairman of the Whitechurch Stouffville Soccer Club, thanked members of the club for giving so much of their time and effort over the week end and congratulated the visiting teams and coaches for their high standard of play and sportsmanlike conduct; a thought voiced throughout the week-end by many visitors and parents.
