Couples planning to wed and single working people are hardest hit. They don't require (or can't afford) a permanent residence and can't find rental places close to their jobs or within their means.

A quick survey in town has revealed that most owners no longer find the rental business worthwhile. In addition, they've learned from experience that many boarders can't be trusted. Apartment buildings here don't come close to meeting the demand. In at least one instance, a waiting list of names is on file. As one walks out, another walks in.

Any new lodgings erected, are snapped up quickly. An example is the second storey in the Success Square Plaza, Main and Stouffer Streets. There's plenty of room available in the commercial establishments below, but the apartments were all spoken for in advance of their completion.

To stand trial
