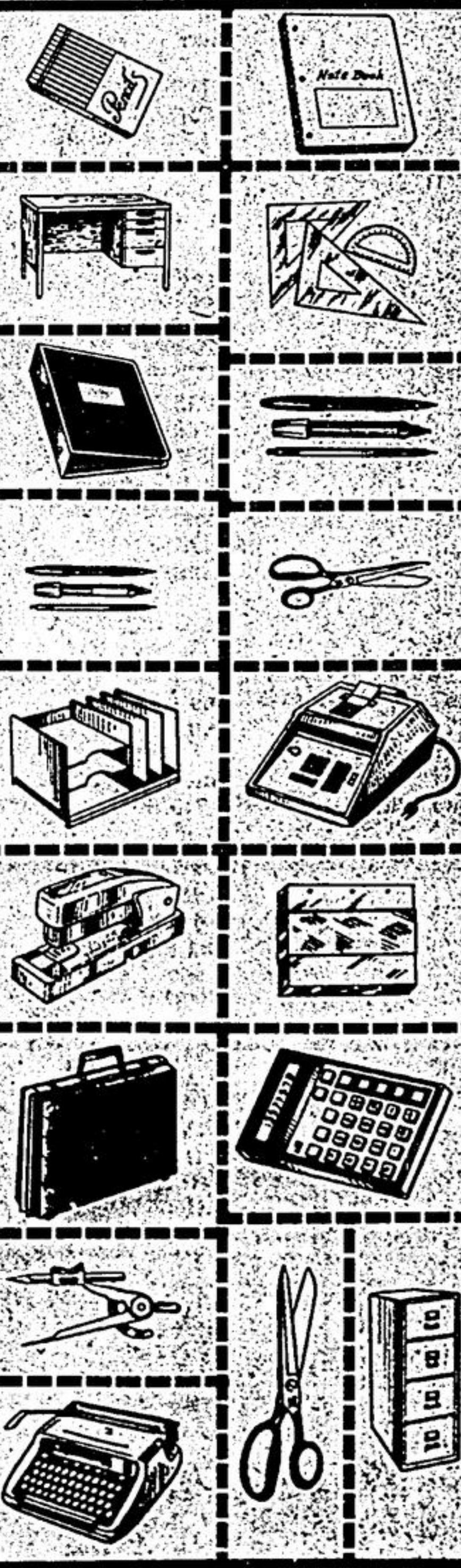
Jr. Foreman
