respected in the Goodwood community and beyond. Born on the Fourth Line of Uxbridge, she spent most of her life in the township. She was an energetic worker in the congregation of the Fifth Line United Church and later the Goodwood United and Baptist.

When the Fifth Line church closed its doors, Mrs. Forsythe was able to pass on much of its history to the Uxbridge-Scott Historical Society. Mrs. Forsythe was active in the Bible Society and only recently was honored by officials of that organization.
