Rosalyn Insley Accomplished artist

MUSS LAKE — "I can paint them, but I can't push them."

Local painter Rosalyn Insley says she loves working at her art, but when it comes to selling them, well, her salesman-husband, Carl, takes care of that.

Her paintings were on display at the Latcham gallery in the Stouffville Library last month.

The 26 year old artist moved from Toronto to Stouffville when she was seven, and attended Orchard Park Public School and Stouffville High. In 1976, she settled

around Musselman's Lake.

Two years prior to that, she graduated from George Brown College in Toronto, majoring in Graphic Design. Since then, Rosalyn has worked for several agencies, including Toronto Calendar magazine as assistant art director from 1974 to 1978.

Her love for art didn't start in public or high school.

"Art was not my favorite subject in school. I always got C's. The teacher would always say 'I was doing it all wrong'."

"Now, in her cozy well-decorated home just off Churchill Drive, she

enjoys the freedom to paint as she pleases. She prefers to work with acrylics because of their versatility, and she always works from photos she has taken.

Rosalyn's creations reflect calm, relaxed atmospheres, and usually involve animals. She uses subdued colors to achieve the mood she desires. She confesses she paints mostly in winter because she can't bear to miss enjoying the beautiful lake they live so close to.

"Summer is used for field trips and taking pictures for future subjects. I believe that nature comes first; then the painting comes out of whatever nature has created."

Rosalyn has thought about teaching her craft because she is disturbed that no color theory is taught in the schools. Apart from painting, she enjoys sewing, cooking, and decorating. But the walls of her home gallery are now bare, for the paintings hang in the library for everyone to enjoy.
