

New college president

MILLIKEN — "A New Thing" is the theme of Richmond College's fall convocation, Sunday, Sept. 16 at 3:30 p.m. The impressive ceremony will be held in First Alliance Church, 3250 Finch Avenue East, Agincourt.

Richmond College is located on Steeles Avenue, east of Kennedy Road, Milliken.

Dramatizing the theme will be the induction of Dr. Ken Campbell, the new college president. Dr. Campbell succeeds Dr. Hugh White, the president at Richmond over the past decade.

Dr. Campbell comes to the leadership of Richmond College from more than a quarter century of inter-church evangelistic ministry. His associate in evangelism for 17 years, Gospel singer Jim Reese, who recently accepted a pastoral appointment in Kitchener, will be providing the ministry of

praise at the convocation. The Campbell-Reese evangelistic Team conducted an average of 25-30 crusades annually throughout North America and overseas in their Team ministry. Mr. Campbell's Christian service began in the general area where Richmond is located. As a 17-year-old he taught the junior room of the Cherrywood Public School, (between Whitevale and Pickering). Later, after graduating from College, he directed the radio and rally ministry of Stouffville Youth For Christ in the late 50s.

Richmond moved to its present location, a former public school in Milliken, (Steeles and Kennedy Road), in 1969, and under Dr. Hugh White's Presidency the College has continued a steady development.

As founder and President of Renaissance

International, Mr. Campbell has become nationally known in recent years as the leading spokesman for the "pro-family" movement.

The convocation address will be given by Dr. Charles Seldenspinner, immediate past President of the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada, Chairman of the Board of the Ken Campbell Evangelistic Association.

Dawn is a graduate Lab Technologist, a level of learning obtained through attendance at the Toronto Institute of Medical Technology. She enrolled there following graduation from S.D.S.S. and going on to the University of Guelph.

Dawn admits there's a lot to learn from a practical standpoint but even in the last few months she's gained considerable knowledge through association with others on the Clinic's staff.

She's our "Girl Next Door".

Dawn has always lived in Stouffville (apart from her out-of-town school years), one of four in the family of Lorne and Marg Schell, Ninth Line North. She has a sister, Yvonne and two brothers, Wally and Harvey.

Dawn still has her beautiful Palamino horse "Apache". The two have almost "grown up" together. She says, however, that she doesn't get to ride him as much as she'd like.

Like her parents, she's active in sports. She plays in the Tuesday Night Ladies League and on the all-star team. Favorite positions are right field or catcher. She loves hockey, in fact, she was one of the persistent people that was successful in bringing girls' hockey back to Stouffville several seasons ago. She has served as a referee in Atom House League hockey and has coached a Squirt Girls' team in house league ball. She's active in badminton and of course, she loves riding her horse.

Dawn speaks with pride of her family, explaining the closeness between them. She, her mother and sister even play on the same ball team. Her one regret is that she wasn't around to see her Dad perform on the mound during his hey-day. 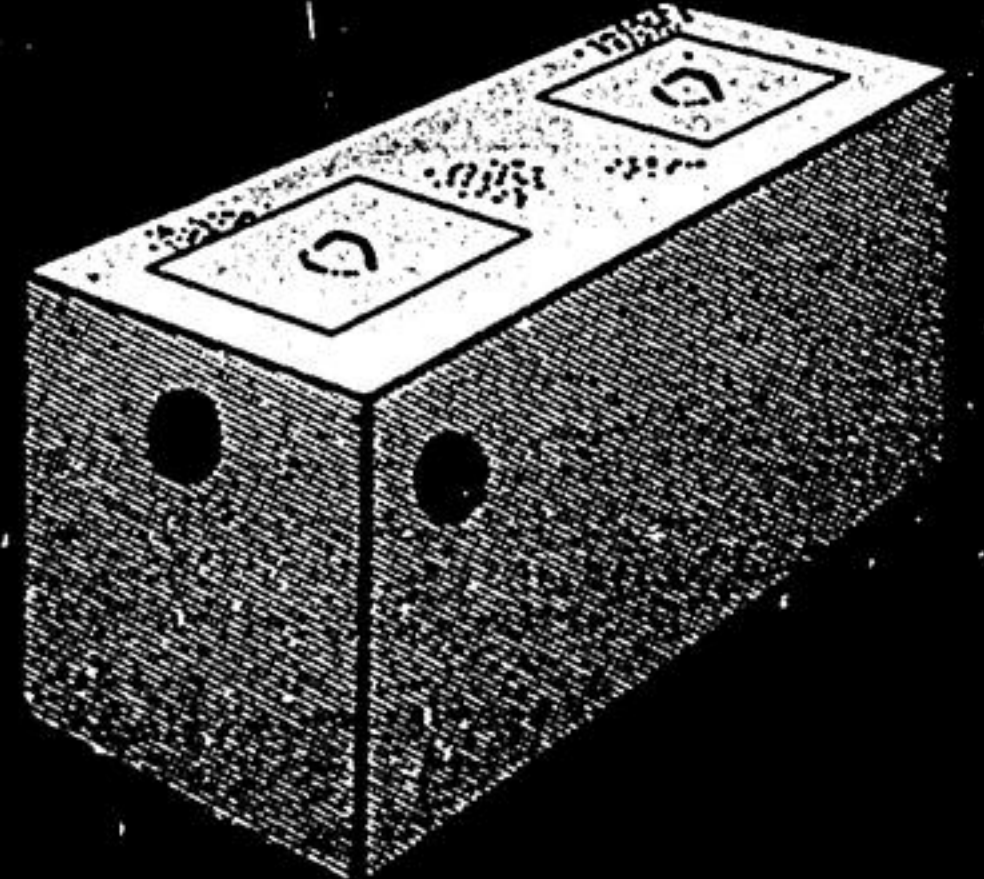
