STOUFFVILLE — Rae and Milton Wollner, 71 Manitoba Street, went out for dinner, Sept. 3. The occasion was their 14th wedding anniversary. What began as a delightful evening, ended sadly when Mr. Wollner suffered a heart attack in the restaurant and died a short time later. He was 49.

Born in Regina, Saskatchewan, he moved with his parents to Toronto at the age of three and resided in Etobicoke where he received his elementary and secondary school education.

Four years ago, Mr. and Mrs. Wollner and daughter Andrea, 7, took up residence in Stouffville, a move they never regretted. The town provided the type of atmosphere they were looking for, Rae said. The neighbors, she noted, had shown a friendliness that could only occur in a community of Stouffville's size. Their help, she said, had been especially appreciated since his passing.

Milton's hobbies included gun and coin collecting as well as reading. Prior to his initial heart attack that occurred about ten years ago, he was an avid curler with membership in the Boulevard Club.

Daughter Andrea was his pride and joy.

It was his wish, Rae said, that his body be donated to science and this request was respected. The Toronto Medical School at the U. of T. work in close co-operation with the C.N.I.B. Rev. Jim Carder conducted a memorial service, Sept. 7, at the Stouffville United Baptist Church.

Besides his wife, the former Rae Dillabaugh and daughter, Andrea, he is survived by his mother, Elsa Wollner in Toronto.

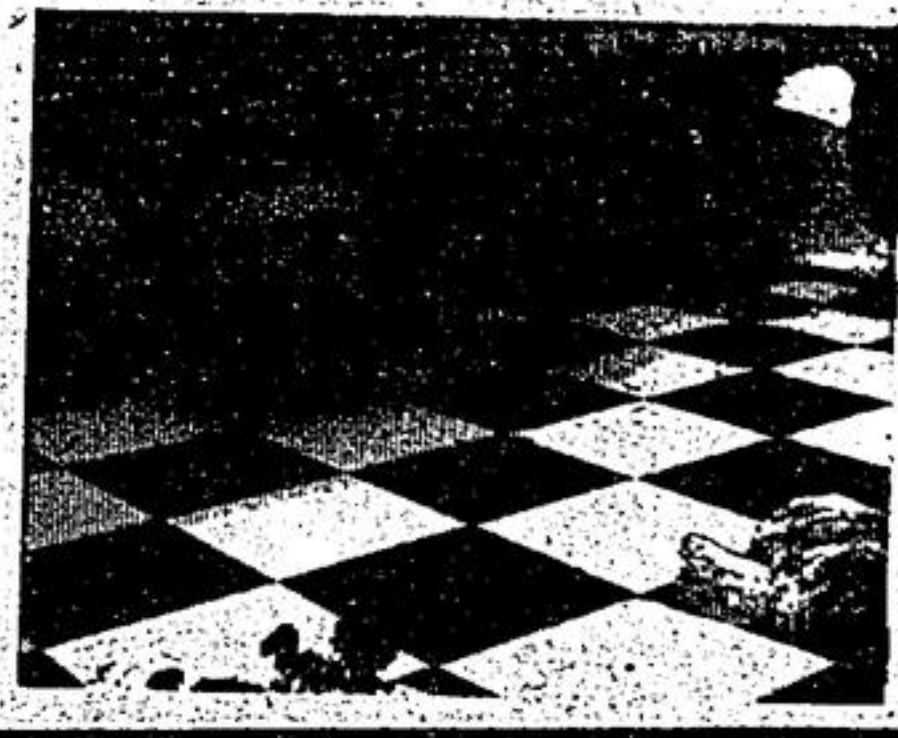

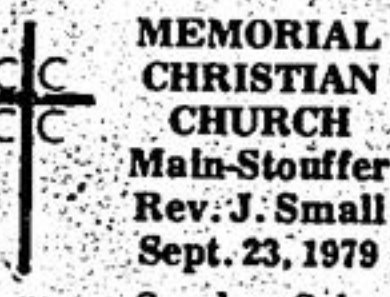

Emmanuel International

Aid to Dominica

Residents of Dominica are suffering from devastation and homelessness since Hurricane David passed through their island on Wed., Aug. 29. In response to pleas for help, Emmanuel International immediately responded with a team of workers.

The first contingent of five young men, was among the first to arrive on the scene of this disaster (Sept. 2). The team was greatly appreciated by the Dominican government, and Emmanuel has been officially recognized and encouraged in their efforts.

Dominique Poponne, a Dominican from Toronto, returned home after being a great help in getting the team established. More supplies and workers were sent down (Sept. 8), bringing the complement to eight. The Emmanuel workers have been kept very busy cleaning-up debris and distributing food to the churches. They have also distributed seeds, which they took with them, and helped in the replanting of gardens destroyed by the 150 m.p.h. winds. Also damaged, or severely damaged, were more than 95 percent of the island's homes. Since roofs are probably the most important component of a home, they have been a special focus of Emmanuel's work. The team has repaired a church roof, and is proceeding to replace or repair the roofs of church members and other residents. This has been possible because of the donation of steel roofing by Eastland Metals of Malton. The steel was driven non-stop to Florida in a Stouffville Rent-all truck, and then flown to Dominica by DC-3.
