# Rule changes

STOUFFVILLE — In an effort to speed up hockey games, the Ontario Hockey Association (O.H.A.) has proposed several rule changes to be put into effect, for testing purposes, in pre-season games this year.

The association, which governs the Major Junior 'A' and all Junior 'B' leagues, will probably select two games from each schedule so as to test the proposed changes. One referee and two linesmen have been chosen who will enforce the new rules in the games.

Proposed changes are: elimination of the centre red line for offside passes; forcing penalized players to remain in the penalty box regardless of how many goals are scored on the power-play; elimination of player

changes during play stoppages, except when a goal has been scored, a penalty called, or an injury has occurred; and the extension of the present goal crease to form a 'basketball type' of key area where offensive players will be allowed to remain for a maximum of five minutes only.

Gary Wilson of the O.H.A. says "While most of the rule changes are self-explanatory, the 'basketball key' arrangement should prove very interesting."

"The back linesman will be responsible for watching the goal crease area and will whistle the play down when an infraction occurs."

"Failure to vacate the offensive zone by the attacking team, in a quick and orderly fashion, will result in a face-off in the attacking team's defensive end."

"Over-all the rules are designed to speed up the game and bring the game back to the skaters. They are also designed to make the players think twice before taking penalties and to stop the fencing that goes on between defencemen and forwards in the goal crease area."

# New schedule

STOUFFVILLE — Registration rate for the Whitchurch Stouffville Minor Hockey Association, has been increased by five dollars for the 79-80 season. It is hoped that the increase will make unnecessary several activities previously undertaken

such as the selling of Minor Hockey Week tickets and special draw tickets. The increased fee will now include the cost of team and individual pictures.

By increasing the fee the Executive hope that coaches and managers will be relieved of the onerous responsibility of collecting, and accounting for, individual players money.

It is expected that the increase will be sufficient to offset funds raised by "draw" methods used in the past.

The Skate-a-thon will still be run as a separate fund raising activity.

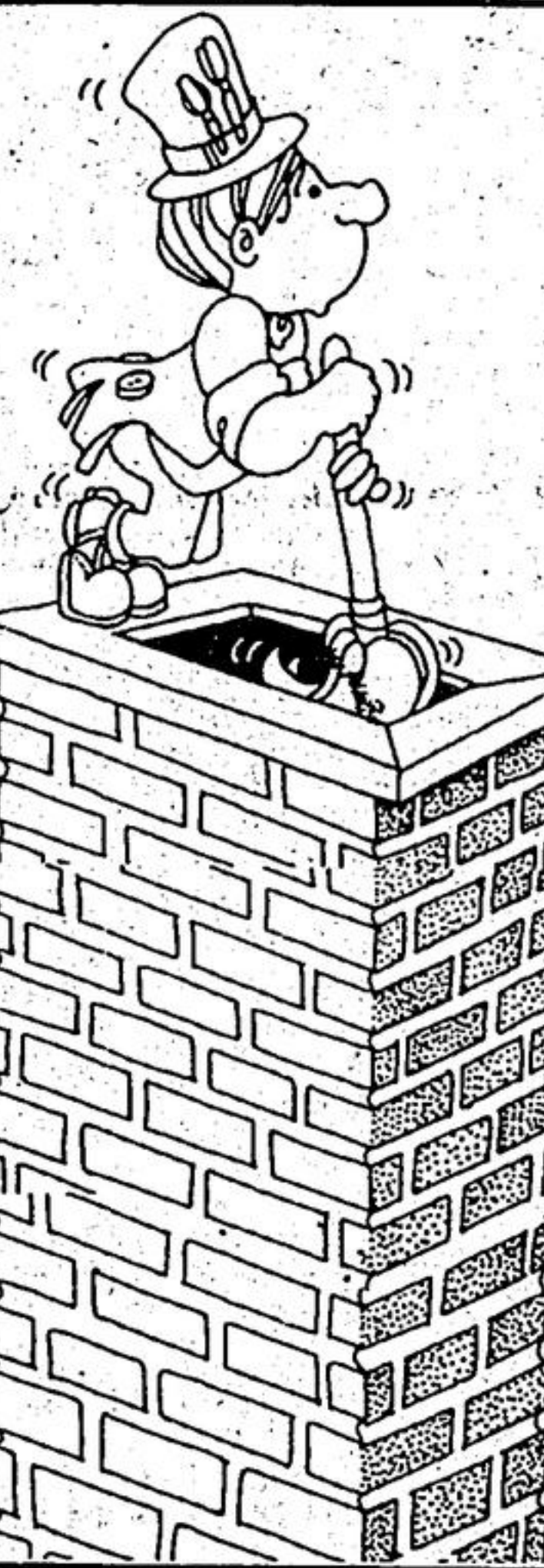
