"Success story"

The 1979 campaign objective for the Markham Unit of the Canadian Cancer Society was \$45,000. When the canvass ended, \$55,825.00 had been collected, "a great success story," President Christine Hindson told the annual meeting at Grace Anglican Church, Markham, Sept. 19. She praised the tremendous co-operation received from all volunteers, mentioning in particular Gordon Taylor, Tim Leishman, Ralph Furneaux and Alf Hill. These men covered the Industrial and Commercial Section of Markham, collecting over \$7,000.

The breakdown by branch was: Markham - \$29,037.96; Unionville - \$11,966.80 and Stouffville - \$10,240.93. Babs Robinson, Markham Unit Campaign Chairman, was presented with an engraved certificate by Bill O'Connor, District Director of the Ontario Division. Avelyn Petch, formerly of Markham, now living at Haliburton was also honored for her work through the years. Avelyn served on the Blood Donor Committee.

The three branch presidents, Chris Hindson, (Markham); Lillian Winterflood, (Unionville); and Jane Graham, (Stouffville) have been succeeded by Marjorea Roblin, (Markham); Marian Warne and May Richards in the same order.
