Those discouraging little accidents are forgotten whenever Wendy looks at her trophy. But her days of competing and winning, are only beginning.

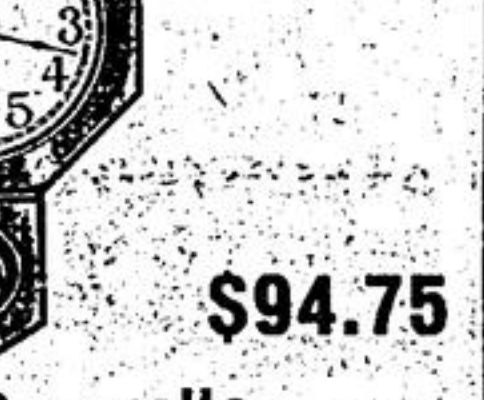
Then, of course, there is choir at school, volleyball, baseball, soccer, and track and field.

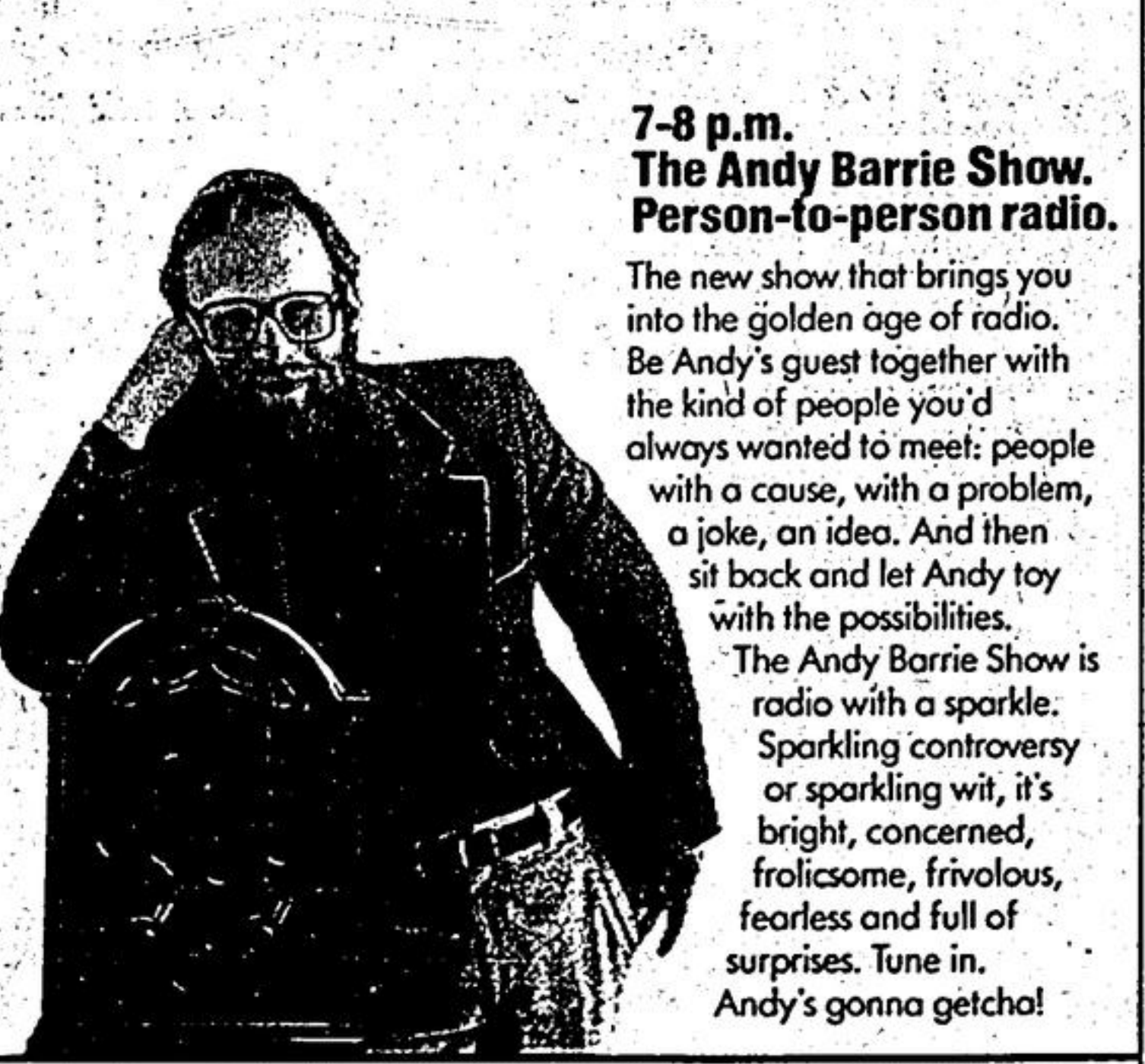

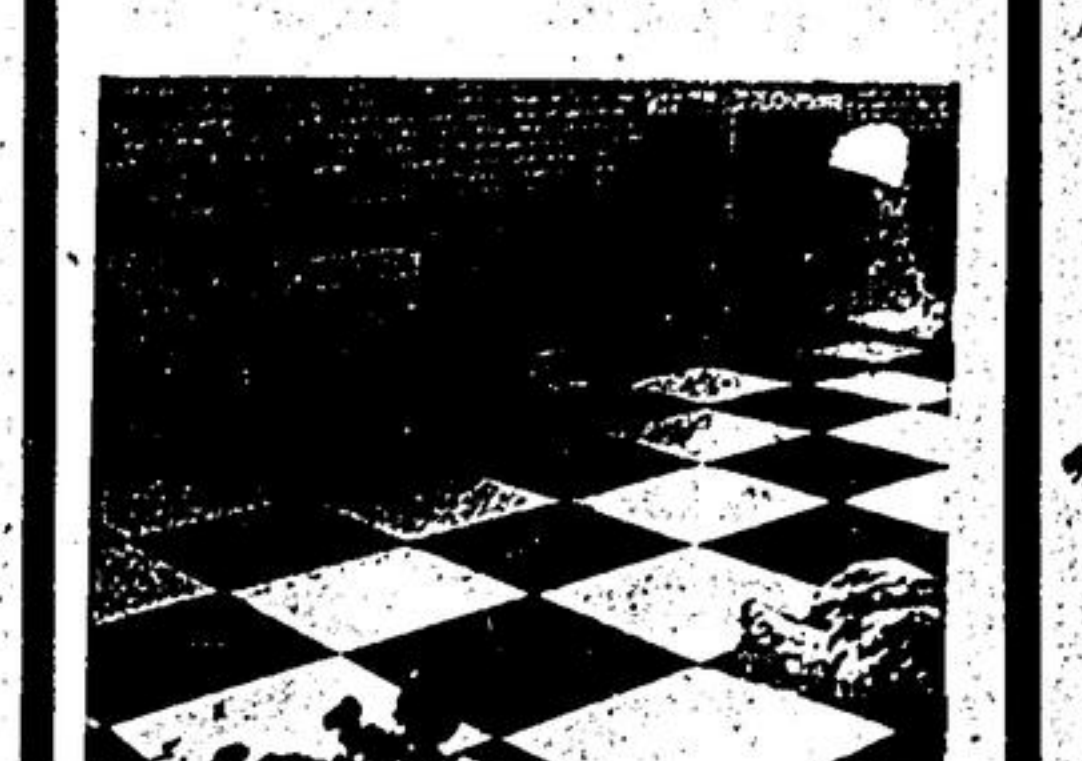
