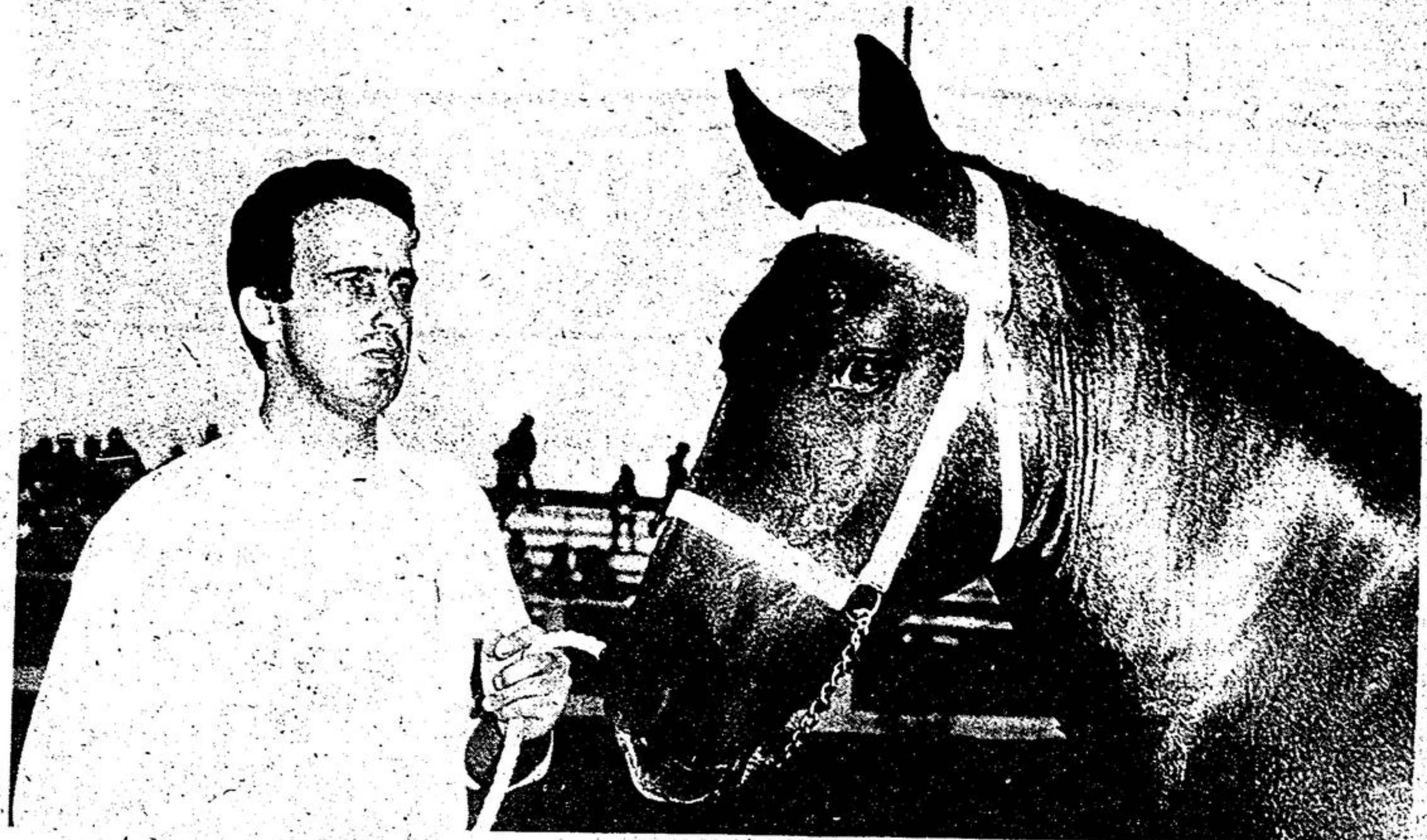


MARKHAM FAIR - BEST EVER

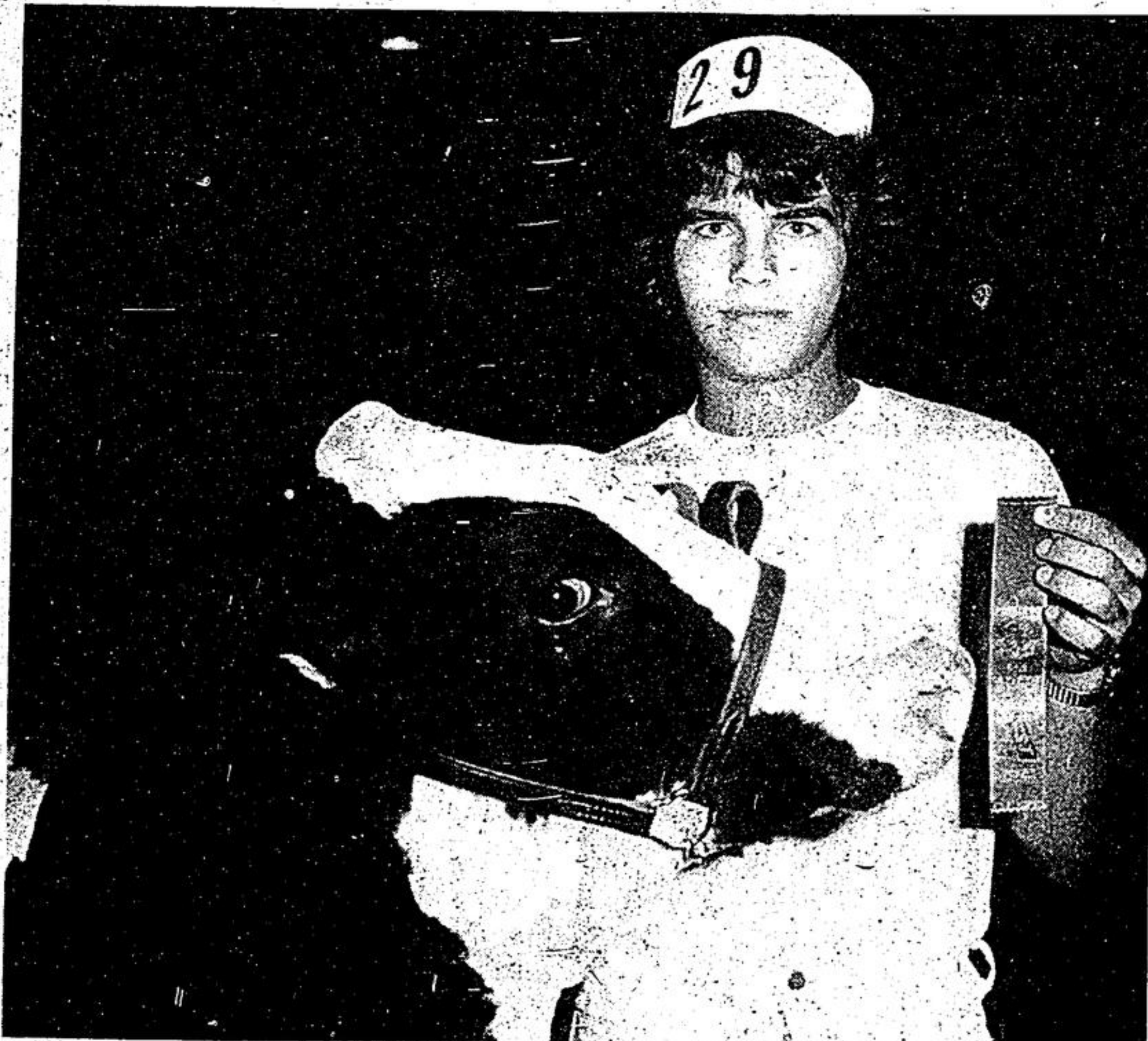

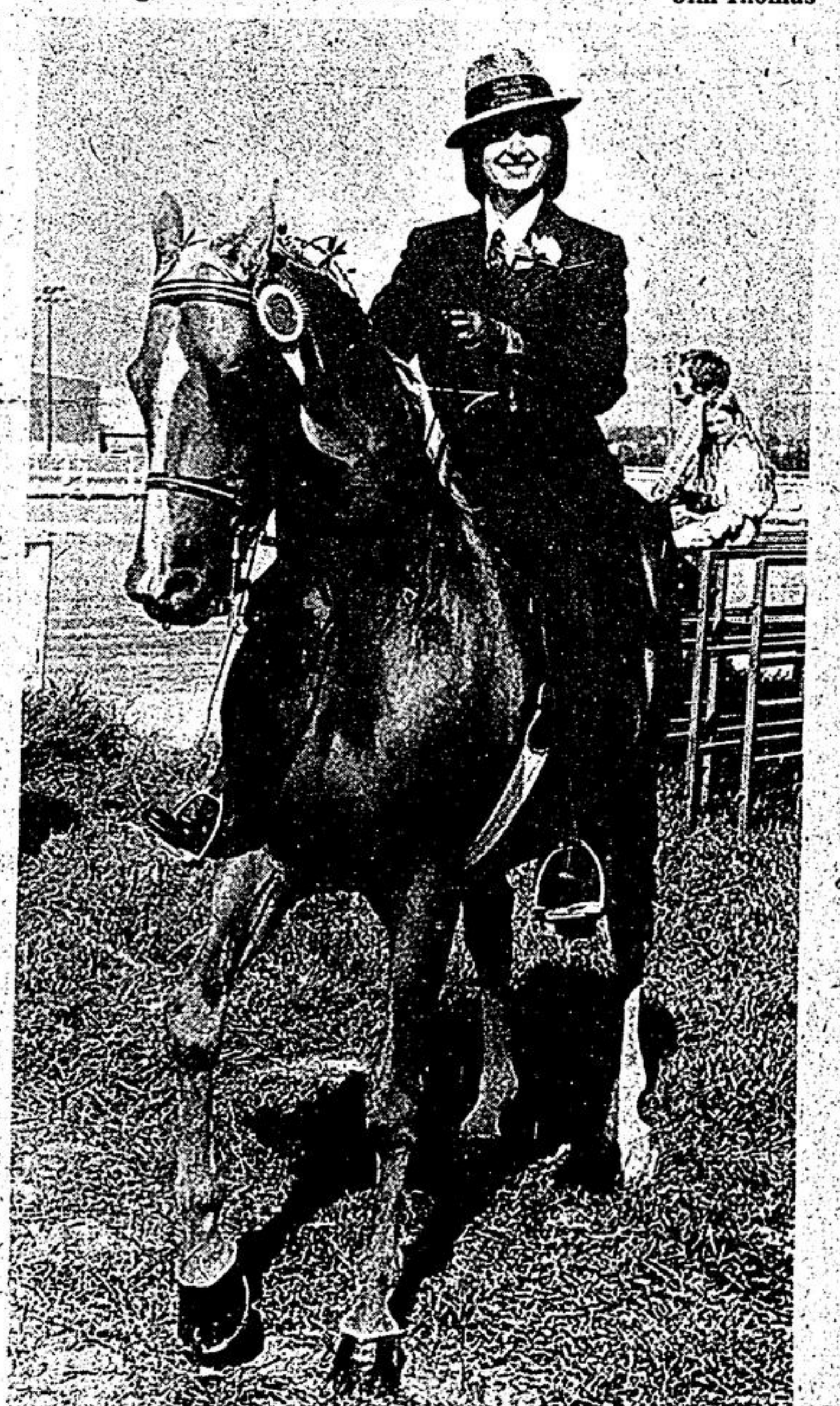

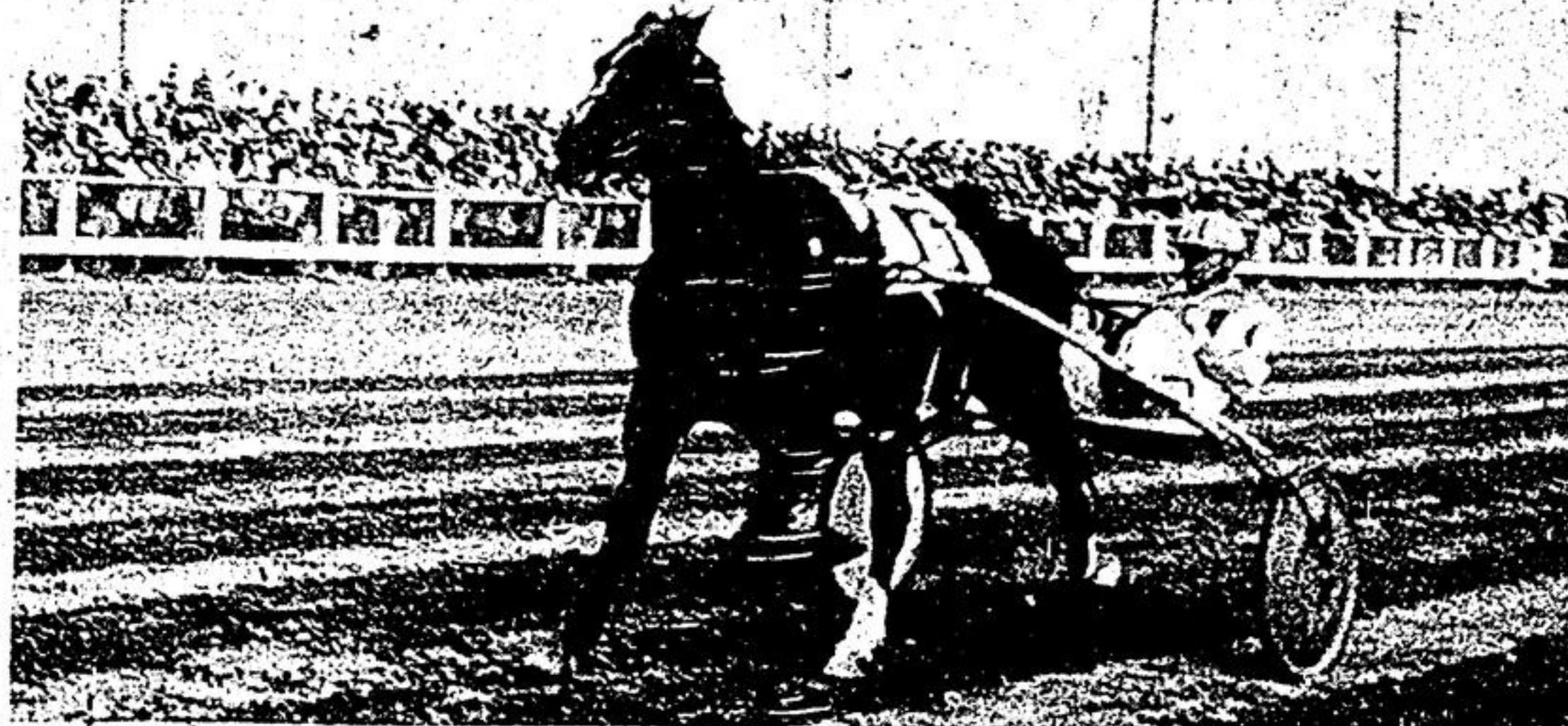
