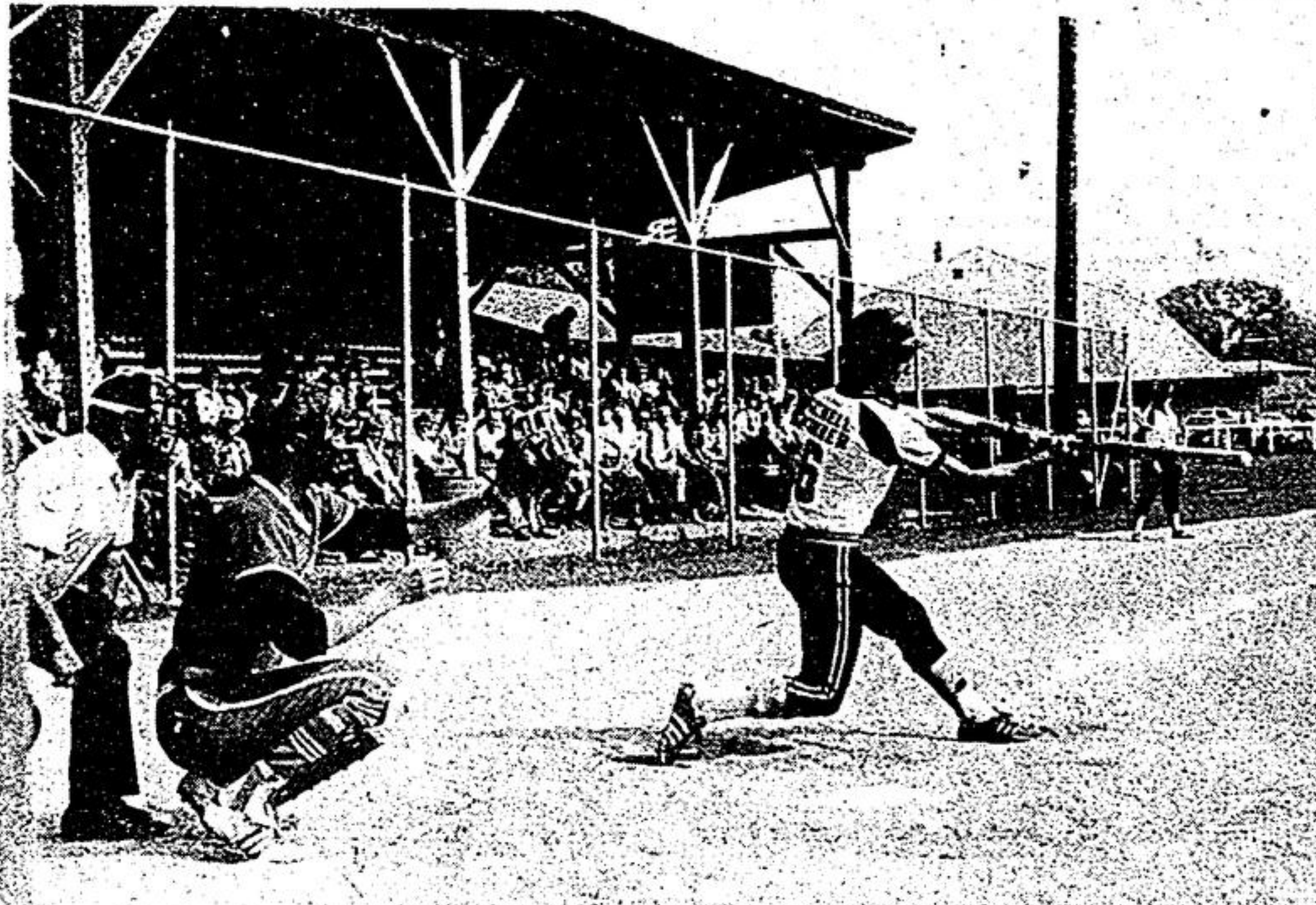
STOUFFVILLE The York County Girls Basketball league got underway last week with Stouffville District Secondary School hosting a double header with King City.

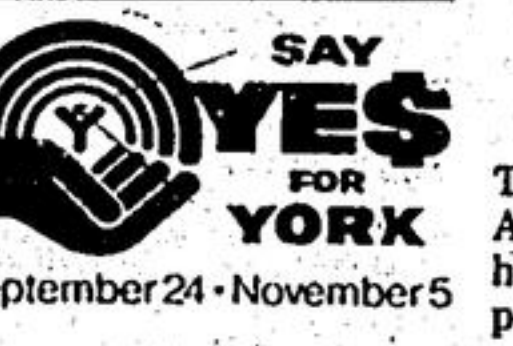
