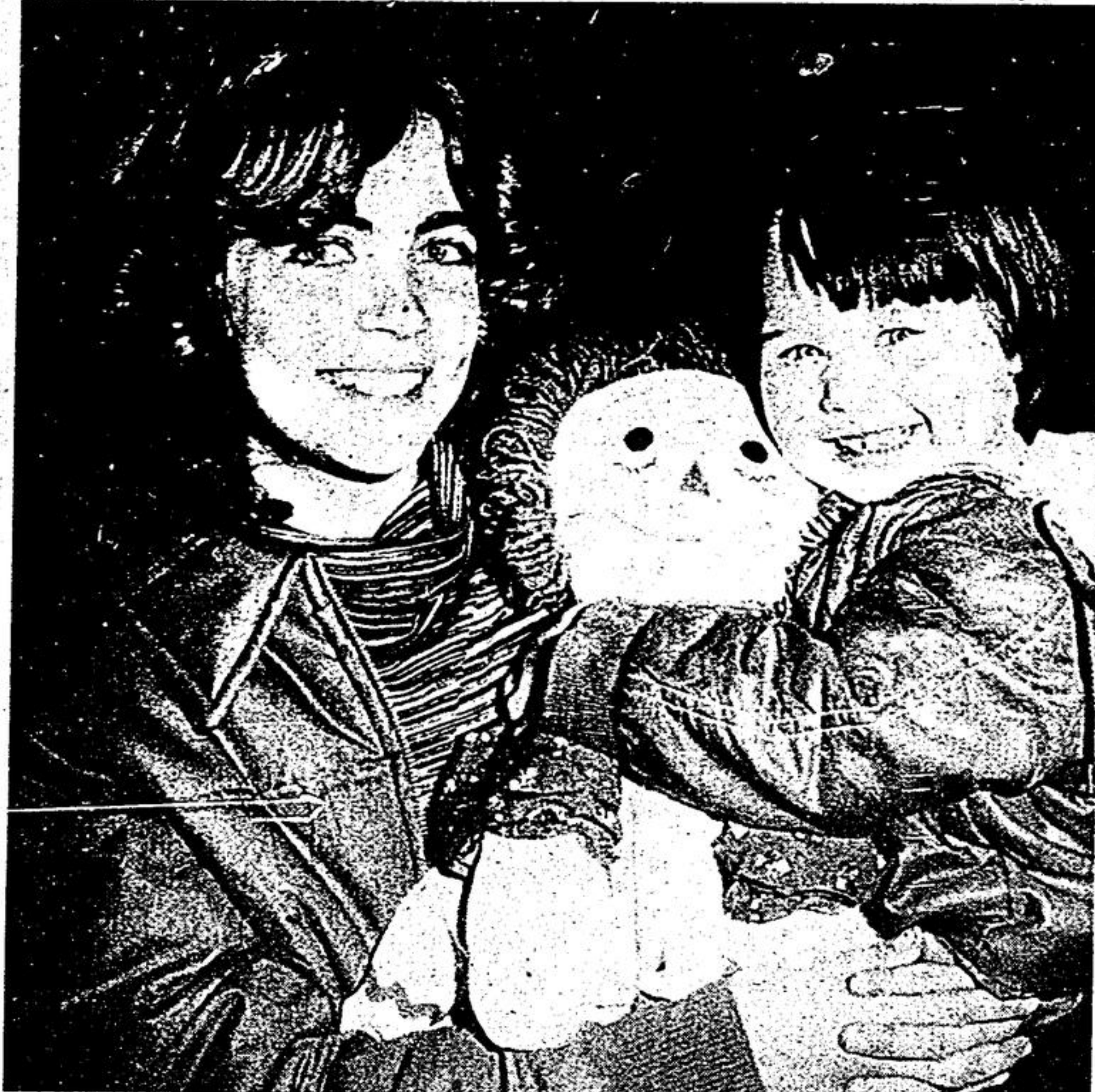

Town target is 400 Block Parent homes

STOUFFVILLE — Oct. 22 to 27 is Block Parent Week in Whitechurch-Stouffville.

This particular period and the months beyond hold special meaning for program here. For the key work is "growth," from two hundred homes to four hundred and from three schools to six.

The chairman is Janet Arends, Manitoba Street, Stouffville.

She's "sold" on the benefits of such an association, not only in urban areas like Stouffville but in rural districts

too. For this reason, she's anxious to expand the program into the communities served by Stouffville Dist. Secondary School, Ballantrae and Whitechurch-Highlands Public Schools. A move in the Ballantrae direction is already underway, she said.

"Some parents feel out in the cold because their services have never been used," Mrs. Arends said. "They shouldn't," she explained, "we hope their services are never needed." However, she added, it's nice to know

they're available should something unexpected occur. And, yes, unexpected things have occurred in Whitechurch-Stouffville. One occasion, a man attempted to lure a little girl into his van. On another, one boy pushed another into a stream and on still another, a child was protected from a vicious dog.

Janet Arends is anxious to "spread the word." Information pamphlets are being placed in local churches, doctors' offices, senior

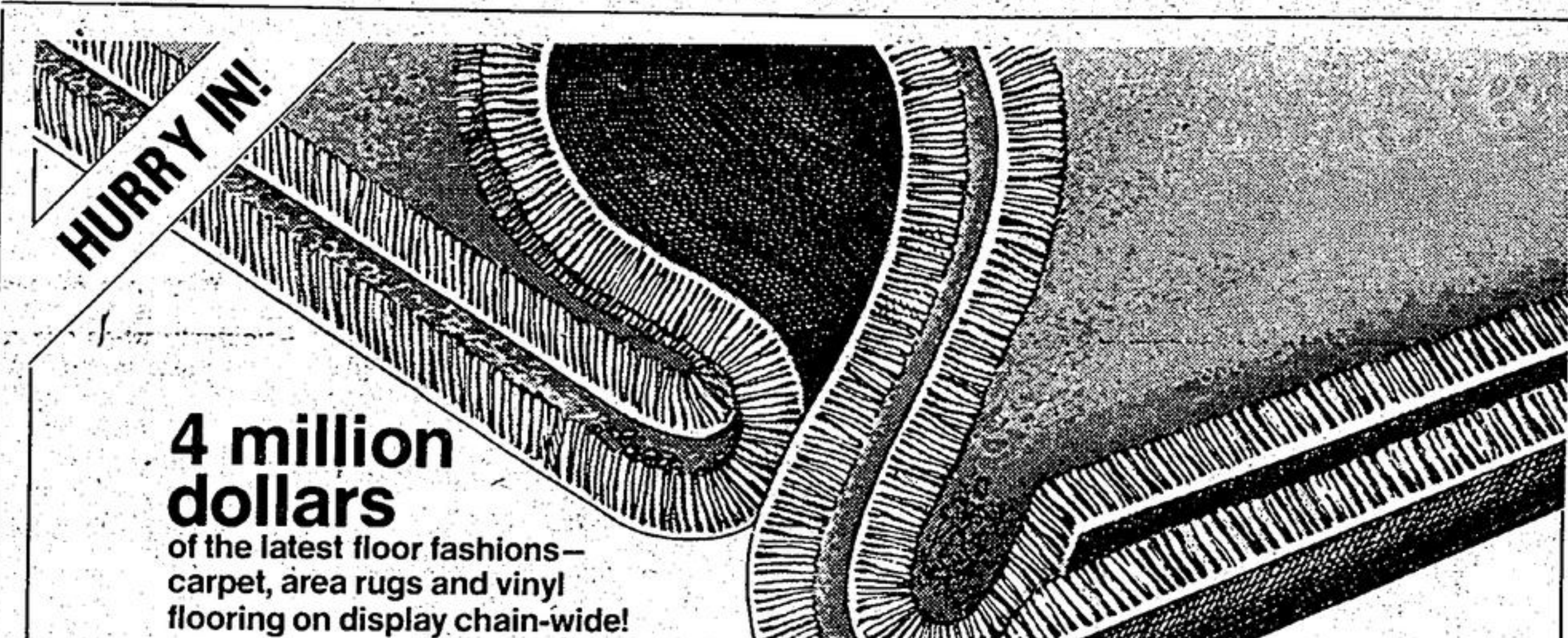
citizens' homes and nursery schools. She's also expressed a willingness to speak to community groups at any time.

So that Stouffville itself is properly covered, she wants a minimum of two Block Parents on every block. To those persons already serving

in this capacity, she asks that no signs be thrown away but rather, turned in for new ones. She also suggests that signs not be removed from windows

when the parent is out, but rather turned around so the blank side is showing. In addition to Mrs. Arends, others on the executive are - Gail

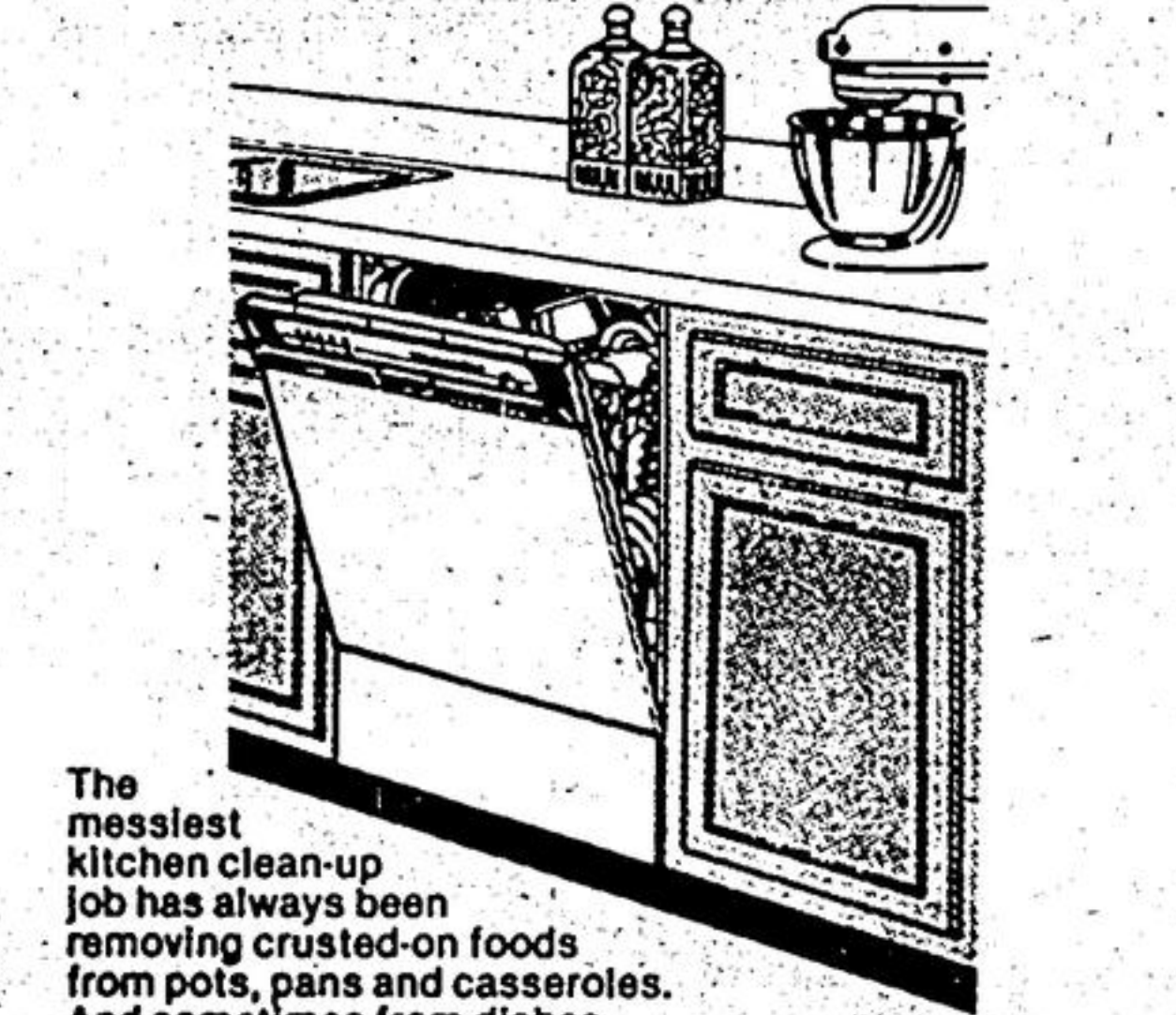
