STOUFFVILLE — When Bill Dyck accepted a sales position at Neil Patrick Motors back in April 1950, he felt he wouldn't last a month.

That was 19½ years ago. Now retired and living in Markham, he retains nothing but good memories of the time spent there, particularly of Neil Patrick himself, a man he describes as "always on the job, six days a week".

This satisfied feeling is mutual. For a card, signed by Neil and presented to him at a recent retirement party reads in part: "To show our appreciation for your nineteen years of punctual, reliable, dependable and sincere service".

Although a resident of Stouffville since 1937, Bill Dyck had been farming near Cannington when he returned to town and joined the Patrick Motors' staff. Glynn 'Red' Chilvers

Humanitarian

MUSS LAKE — To folks around Musselman's Lake, Glynn Chilvers was just plain "Red". But to those who knew him best, the name didn't matter. For in life as in death, all would call him 'friend'. That's the way he was, continually offering assistance to those who needed it most. And even in the short six years he lived on Mitchell Drive, those numbers were many.

"Red" Chilvers died, Fri., Oct. 12 at the age 66, a loss that's been keenly felt by the entire community.

The deceased was a humanitarian who, in the words of a close companion "had no class but was class itself". While people were important, he also loved

birds and animals. He raised rabbits, chickens and pigeons but apart from this, often took pity on strays and brought them home. On one occasion, he rescued a hawk with a broken wing. "Red" Chilvers was born in Toronto. Before moving to the Lake, he resided on a small 30 acre property near Sunderland. For several years, he worked with his step-son, Norm Barker of Barker Roofing at Dickson's Hill. A second step-son, Don Barker, lives in Stouffville.

Besides his wife, the former Alice Draper, he also leaves one sister, Edith Watson in Toronto; an aunt, Kelso Manning, Toronto; a nephew, Beverly Chilvers, Pefferlaw; nine grandchildren and three

great-grandchildren. Service was held from the funeral chapel of O'Neill's Stouffville with interment, Stouffville Cemetery.
