

# Close finish

**STOUFFVILLE** — In their home game against Port Perry on Wednesday 17 October, the Anderson Haulage Clippers played a very fast game, to take their first win of the season 6-5.

Bruce Rugelis put the Clippers on the scoreboard early in the first period, with an assist from Bill Ackroyd. Port Perry failed to score in this period.

It was the second period that gave the Clippers their problems; penalties again. No less than three Clippers penalties in rapid succession gave Port Perry their chance to notch-up three quick goals. Had it not been for Clippers goalie Dean Howse there would have

been a lot more. Jamie McKay gave the Clippers their second goal with Glen Gibson setting it up. Rugelis came in for his second goal of the game with a nice pass from Kevin Bartley just two minutes before the end of the period. One minute later, with the score tied three apiece, Rugelis again went to work and gave up a perfect pass to Glen Gibson who neatly flicked it into the net.

With five minutes left in the final period Kevin Bartley made a copy book goal when Bill Ackroyd made a clean breakaway from the Clippers blue line, gave the Port Perry defence a lesson in puck control and laid it right on Bartley's stick. It was the nicest goal of the evening.

With a 5-4 lead towards the end of the third, Ted Waite gave the Clippers their insurance goal with a pass by Jamie McKay. It was just as well he did for without it the game would have been another frustrating tie for the Clippers. With only 12 seconds on the clock Port Perry made a strong come-back and scored their final goal.

Without doubt, this was a good game for the Clippers. After five games they are beginning to show their potential.

Future Clipper games are: tonight October 25 at Port Hope and October 26 at Port Perry and October 31 at home to Beaverton.

# Cross-Country

**YORK REGIONAL** — In the York County Public School cross country meet, held at the Vivian Forest on Thursday October 18, no less than 27 schools took part with an extremely strong contingent from Summitview School, Stouffville.

There were no less than 13 teams entered in the girls 1500 metre event, in which Summitview's Mary Hoey took an early lead. Despite pulling a muscle, which gave her considerable pain, Mary hung on to her 10 yard

lead over Kelly Pearson of Baythorn, and gave everything she had to complete the last hundred yards of a stiff uphill section of the course for a well deserved first place from over 150 runners. Summitview also managed sixth place in the team standings in this race.

In the first race of the day, the 1,000 metres for boys, Jeff Christensen took third place overall, finishing closely behind two Unionville runners. The team finished third overall, only four points

behind Franklin Street School.

In the girls 2,000 metres Summitview had no individual placings in the first five but the team put in an excellent performance to finish third overall out of the twelve schools entered.

Top performance of the day came from Franklin Street School who took no less than two individual and two team awards in the girls 1,000 metres and 2,000 metres events in addition to placing well in other events.
