Industry doubles target

YORK REGION — The 1979 goal for York Region's United Way campaign is \$495,000. The target for the industrial sector is \$100,000, double the figure of '78.

Chairman of this division is Gibb Coons of Pitt Steel Limited, Woodbine Avenue, Markham.

Mr. Coons says industry has put forth a big effort this year with both employers and employees organizing in-plant committees. "Results are very encouraging; the response has been excellent," he said.

Pitt Steel is very much a part of the fund-raising drive. The most senior employee to make a pledge is 71 year old Gordon Bell of Mill Street, Stouffville. Others on staff include a son, Harold and three grandsons, Ronnie, David and Tim. Gordon's been with the firm ten years.

Gibb Coons is one hundred percent back of the campaign and his enthusiasm is obviously "rubbing off" on others. He claims one of every four persons in York Region benefits directly from the appeal.
