

Rev. Walter Gawa A 'family' pastor

VIVIAN — At McCormack Memorial Christian Church, Vivian, "togetherness" is the key to success.

This is the feeling of Rev. Walter Gawa, new pastor in the community since the end of September.

Now a self-supporting charge, Rev. Gawa appreciates the "one for all" co-operation that, he says, is so apparent within the congregation, including adults, teenagers and children.

"Everyone is very willing to accept responsibility," he points out, "particularly the young people". The Y.P. executive, he says, run their own program, with some assistance from outside if needed. He encourages inter-action so there's no gap between generations.

"It's a very caring community," Rev. Gawa claims, "all are interested in each other".

Strangely enough, it was a former minister who put him in touch with the Vivian charge. Rev. Norman Rowan, now of Kitchener, mentioned the fact that a pulpit vacancy would be occurring since Bloomington had elected to carry on alone. The two met at the Muskoka Baptist Conference near Huntsville.

Prior to coming to Vivian, Rev. Gawa had served as a pastoral assistant at Meadowvale in Mississauga.

Born in Toronto, he received his formal education there as well as in Saskatchewan, London, Ont., and Ottawa. Between Rev. Sorley's leaving and his arrival, he said the deacons carried on very well with some excellent programs. He admits "going it alone" is a big step for Vivian but the response has all been positive and attendance very encouraging. It's not unusual to have between fifteen and twenty people at prayer meetings, Thursday evenings. A girls' club, eight years and over, meets at the church, Tuesday's with Young People's every Friday.

Worship times are 11 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. Sunday School is at 9:45 a.m.

Rev. Gawa doesn't mind admitting his wife Carol is a tremendous help in the ministry. She plays the church organ and often accompanies him on visitations. A daughter, Jeannine attends public school at Ballantrae.

The Vivian minister's pastoral plan is basic, "to uphold the word of God and convey it in a manner that will meet man's needs".

Goodwood lady finds new joy

GOODWOOD — Mrs. Grace Wood of Goodwood is thankful to be alive.

On July 9, she underwent a triple coronary aorta bypass during open-heart surgery at Toronto General Hospital.

Without this operation, she had less than two weeks to live. Mrs. Wood agreed to it, knowing she had malignant hyperthermia, a rare allergic reaction to anaesthetic and muscle replants.

Due to the fact one of the arteries did not graft properly, Grace has been left with an angina problem and a post-operative pleuritic condition. At present, she's controlled mainly by an experimental drug researched by the hospital and medical authorities.

On Sept. 6, she suffered a near-fatal heart attack. However, thanks to Dr. A.M. Haralampides; Registered Nurses Eva Ball and Brenda Welch; her daughter Anne and ambulance attendants Karen O'Neill and Steve Brian of Uxbridge Cottage Hospital, she was transported immediately to the Toronto General Hospital.

While resorting to the use of a wheelchair, she's often asked the question, "Do you ever feel like giving up?" Her answer is an unqualified "no". She rejoices in the faith that the Lord restored her life and gave her peace and joy.

She also rejoices for the God-given skills of physicians, Dr. Richard Wiesel, Dr. A.A. Bookman, Drs. Leonard Schwartz, Henderson, Zapalinsky and Reznick, staff nurses, physiotherapists and lab technicians from the coronary care unit of the Toronto General, also Miss Starkey and efficient staff from the second floor college wing.
