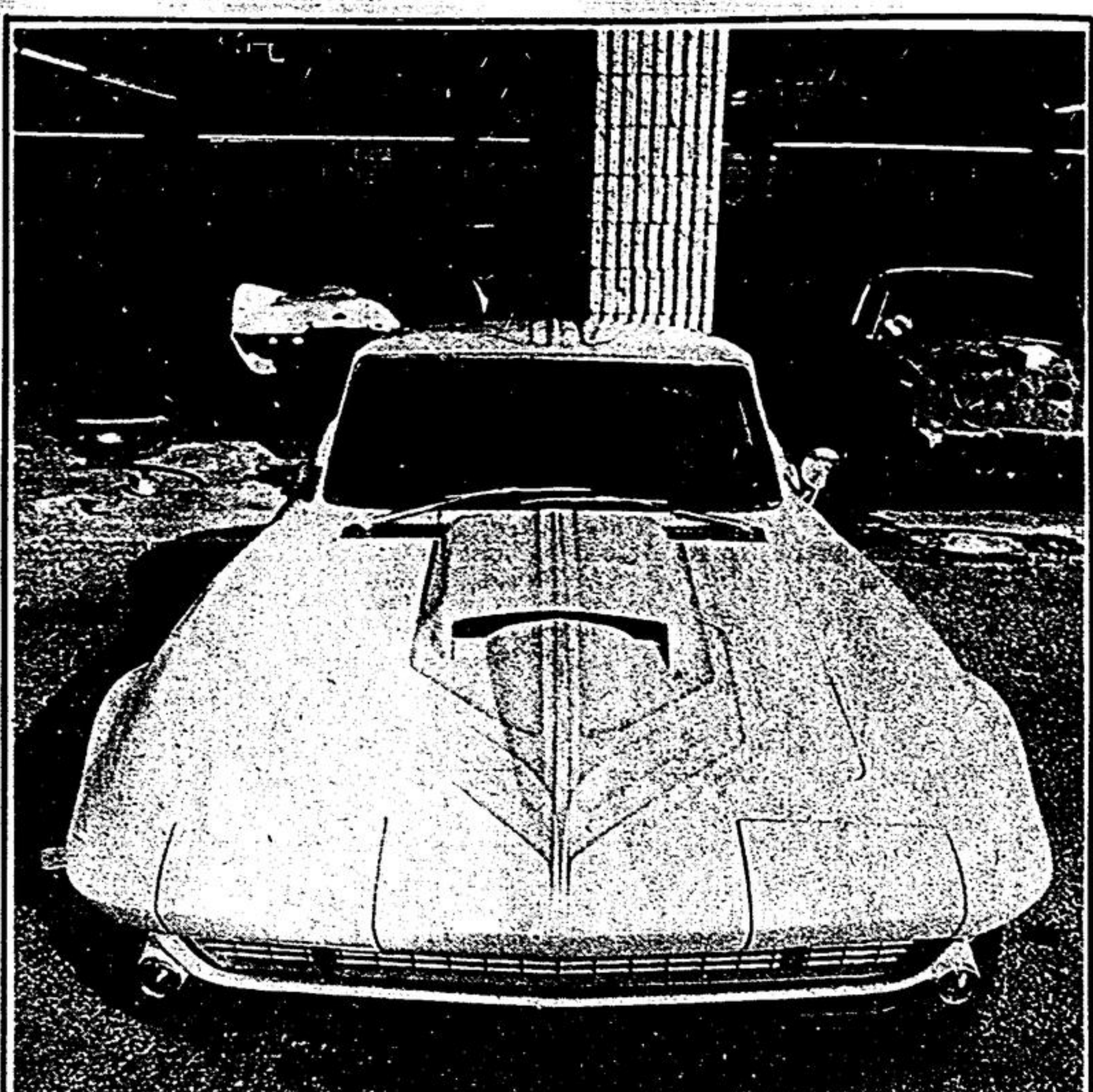


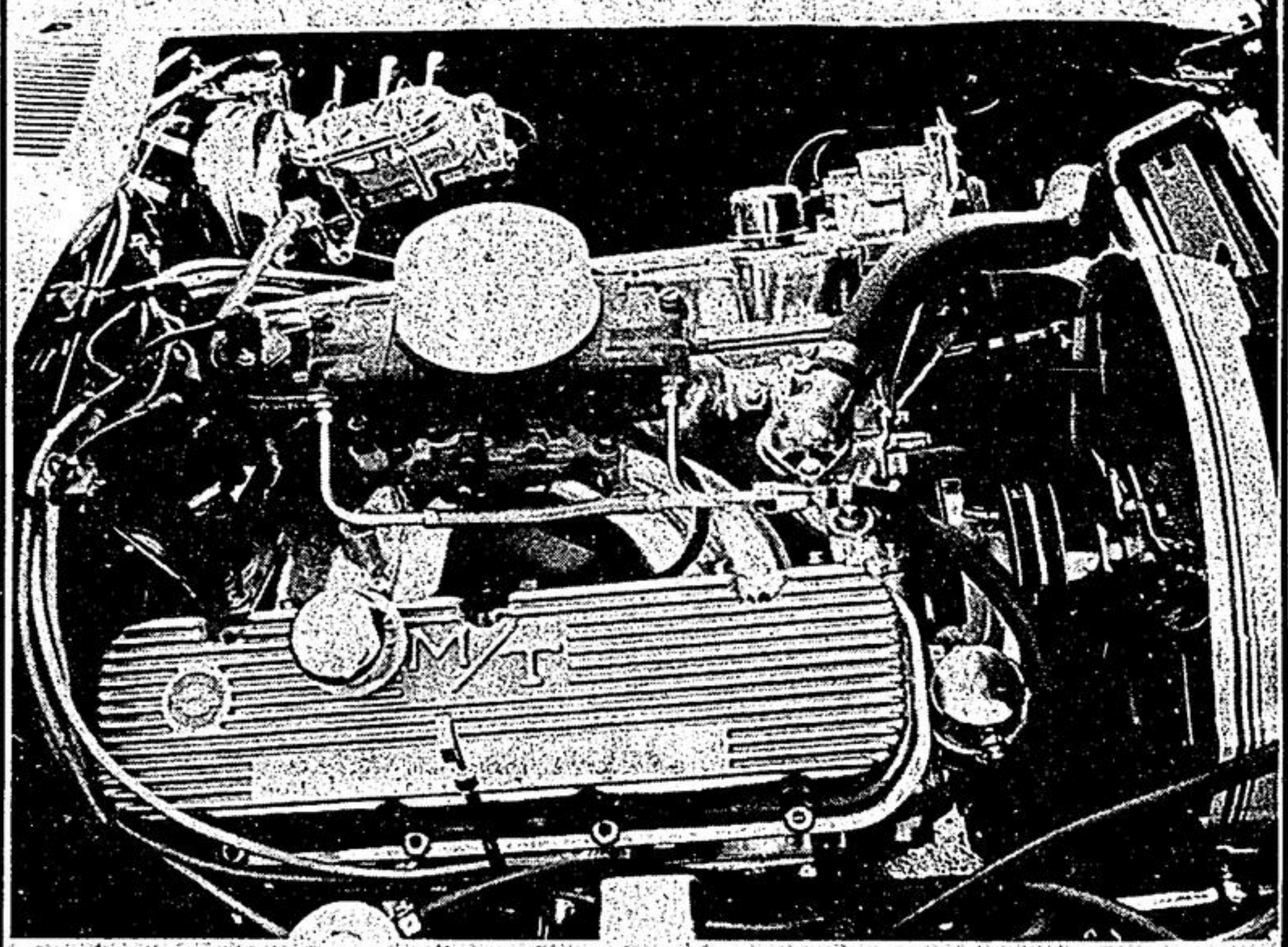

## "Strictly Corvettes" Gormley firm becomes famous

GORMLEY — In "the good old days" when one could have a car 'made to measure', there were several famous world-wide body shops. Firms such as Hooper, James Young, Brewster are now deceased or restricted to limited production.

Automobiles are now mass produced. So, in place of coach-builders are exclusive custom shops. Many of these are in California — places that can fulfill the dreams of the most ardent auto-enthusiast — at a price.

However, it's not necessary to go 4,000 miles to seek out this kind of service, not necessary if you own a Corvette. A shop, second to none is located on Woodbine Avenue, north of Gormley. It's called "Strictly Corvettes" and, with the odd exception, the operation is just what the name implies — strictly Corvettes.

Three partners, Wayne Lambert, Wayne Smith and Russell Eagen cater to the wildest whims and fancies of Corvette owners everywhere.

It all started back in 1971. They found a backyard location a bit too small, so moved to their present site. There, like little

Audrey, the business just "grew and grew." In fact, the premises is three times its original size and their craftsmanship is known across the country.

Whatever the job, these men can do it. First they start with the chassis; strip it down until it's meticulously clean, then apply the paint. One Corvette, for example, is being readied for no less than thirty coats. Another is having its supercharged engine overhauled.

Sparkling in the morning sunlight outside, was a beautiful 1963 fibre-glass body on a 1967 chassis. The switch was performed to give it disc brakes. This magnificent machine boasted a 454 cubic inch, 4-barrel aluminium head motor or 'mill' as the enthusiasts call them. It's worth has been placed at \$25,000.

Despite their involvement in body customizing, the firm gives top priority to body repairs. This is the mainstay of their business. That is why, even if you have a rather tired Corvette and \$12,000 to spend, you may wait anywhere up to eight months. However, the end result is well worth waiting for — the transformation of a pumpkin into a royal coach.
