## Pretty Fraulein German student attends S.D.S.S.

STOUFFVILLE — Many parents might wonder at this remark but sixteen year old Heike Lewald says discipline in Canadian high schools (at least at Stouffville's high school) is much more rigid than in Germany.

And Heike should know. For the pretty sixteen year old is spending three months here. Her host during this time is Gil Langley, Albert Street South. Next spring, Gil will complete the exchange with Heike the host.

Here at S.D.S.S., Heike is taking such subjects as French, English, Typing and Home Economics. She's also a member of the school choir and, according to leader Jim Rehill, "was a beautiful voice".

What has impressed Heike most? The big cars and even bigger highways, she says, particularly Hwy. 401 that she describes as "frightening". She's also taken note of the vast "open spaces" here.

One thing displeases her — Canadian bread. She likens it to "plastic". The Langley's have been able to solve that problem, however, by obtaining loaves to her liking at the Italian Villa Bakery on Edward Street.

The school day here is considerably longer than in Germany, she explains. At home, classes conclude at 1:30 p.m. However, every other Saturday, they go from 8 to 11:30 a.m.

Social life is also lacking at Stouffville High,

she feels, "probably because the kids spend so much time doing homework".

Heike appreciates the help she's received from the teachers and likes them all, particularly the Phys. Ed. staff.

What about Canadian boys? she was asked. With tongue in cheek, she suggested German boys are more handsome. She qualifies this observation somewhat by admitting S.D.S.S. has its share of good looking guys, particularly Luis Correa, a star with last year's Jr. Spartans' rugby team.

Heike herself is something of a cross between Audrey Hepburn and Leslie Carron.

Although she hasn't experienced any periods of homesickness, there's something she really misses — German wine. It's all part of the meal in her country, she says, with each member of the family helping herself within reason of course. The drinking age in Germany is sixteen. The driving age is nineteen.

Heike is an experienced traveller, having visited such countries as France, Spain, England, Italy, Yugoslavia, Norway, Italy and now Canada.

Both Heike and Gil agree it's an enlightening and enjoyable experience. "Like sisters" is the way they describe their newfound friendship.

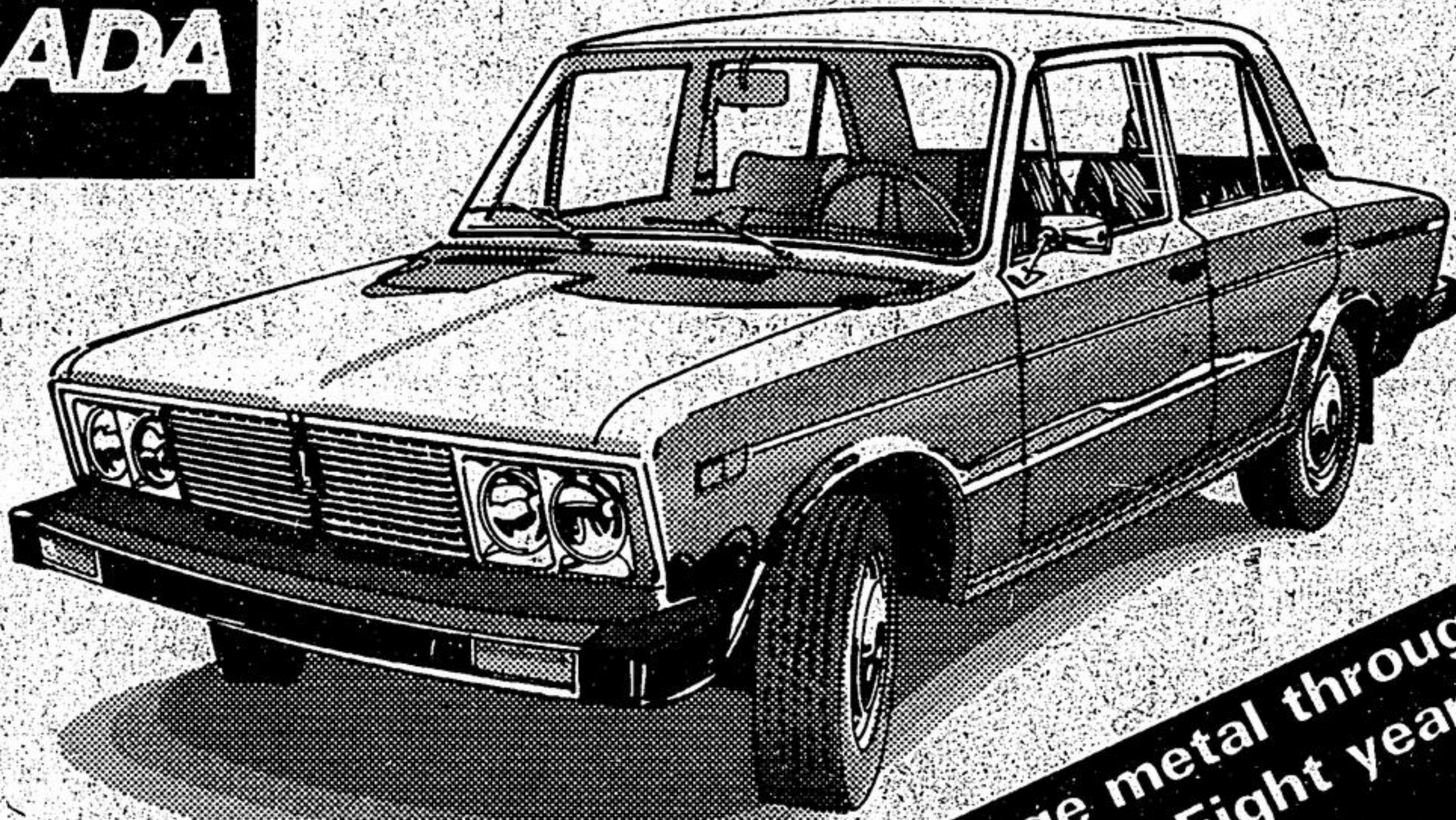
Would you like to come back? she was asked. "Yes," she answered positively, "and go to university".
