Notice of PUBLIC MEETING and INFORMATION CENTRES on the INTERIM OFFICIAL PLAN 1979

A PUBLIC MEETING will be held on THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 22nd, 1979 at 8 P.M. in LATCHAM HALL, 32 Park Drive South, STOUFFVILLE

INFORMATION CENTRES will be held on MONDAY, NOVEMBER 26th, 1979 from 3 P.M. to 8 P.M. in the MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 19 Civic Avenue, STOUFFVILLE AND TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 27th, 1979 from 3 P.M. to 8 P.M. in the WHITCHURCH CENTENNIAL COMMUNITY CENTRE, BALLANTRAE (Northside of Aurora Road east of Highway No. 48)

A Public Meeting preceded by two Information Centres will be held as noted above on behalf of the Planning Committee of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville to present the proposed Interim Official Plan 1979 to the public. The Planning Committee invites you to attend the Public Meeting and Information Centres.

The purpose of the Public Meeting is to obtain objections to and comments on the proposed Interim Official Plan 1979. If you are unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to December 10th, 1979.

The Information Centres will provide an opportunity to review the proposed Interim Official Plan 1979 prior to the Public Meeting. The Planning Consultant for the Town will be in attendance to answer inquiries regarding the Official Plan document.

The Interim Official Plan 1979 document may be examined at the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville during the regular business hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). A copy of the document may be purchased at the Municipal Building for \$5.00. In addition, the document may be examined at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library, 65 Main Street West, Stouffville.

Note: The Interim Official Plan 1979 is a consolidation of the New Official Plan entitled Interim Official Plan 1976 which was the subject of Public Meetings in October, 1976 at Stouffville, Ballantrae and Vandorf. Subsequent to these meetings, all objections were considered by Planning Committee, minor policy and mapping revisions authorized, and a draft document entitled Interim Official Plan 1977 was prepared. This draft document has been edited resulting in the proposed Interim Official Plan 1979. Although minor policy and mapping revisions have been made and the size of the document has been considerably reduced, the retention of the original policies has been observed and the Town Planning Consultant is of the opinion that this has been accomplished.

Parties who participated in the consideration of the 1976 document and, in particular, those who registered objections are encouraged to examine the new 1979 document.

Policies resulting from the STOUFFVILLE WESTERLY APPROACH AREA STUDY are included in the Interim Official Plan 1979.
