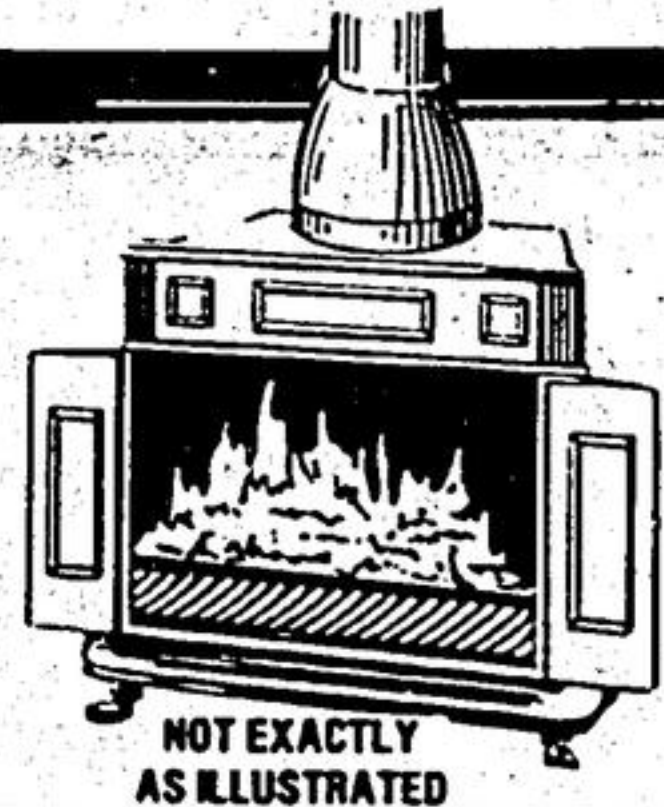

THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK

NINTH LINE

(Regional Road No. 69)

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

- the widening and reconstruction of Regional Road No. 69 (Ninth Line) in the town of Whitechurch - Stouffville from the Regional Road No. 40 (Bloomington Road) to a point approximately 500 feet north of Lakeshore Road to a basic width of 100 feet with additional widening at cuts, fills and its intersection with Regional Road No. 40 (Bloomington Road);
- the grading, graveling and paving thereof to provide a basic two lane roadway with additional turning lanes at the intersection at Regional Road No. 40 (Bloomington Road);
- the site preparation, fencing, construction of culverts, drainage works and all other related works and undertakings; and
- the acquisition of the necessary lands and interests in lands.

Pursuant to section 446 of The Municipal Act, the Engineering Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 10:00 a.m. on the 4th of December, 1979 at the Engineering Building on the west side of Woodbine Avenue one and one quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard is requested to advise the undersigned prior to the meeting. If any party entitled to be heard does not attend at the hearing, the Committee may proceed in his absence and he will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceedings.
