

Industrial plan

STOUFFVILLE — Neil Laboratories Whitchurch - Stouffville Planning Board has approved in principle, a revised industrial draft plan for development of lands at the rear of Mc-

The new proposal, put forward by owner Ron Fenson, includes eighteen lots, averaging 2.5 acres apiece. This adheres to the Board's recommendation of lot sizes not under two acres. A buffer zone of 25 feet will be created to the east with a requirement for additional screening to the north.

(Regional Road No. 14)

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

1. the stopping up and closing of existing Regional Road No. 14 (Stouffville Road) in the Hamlet of Gormley between the west and east limits of the CNR right-of-way in Concession 3 of the Town of Richmond Hill (formerly the Township of Whitchurch); and
2. the construction of turning basins on the existing Regional Road No. 14 (Stouffville Road) in the Hamlet of Gormley adjacent to the west and east limits of the CNR right-of-way crossing Regional Road No. 14 (Stouffville Road) in Concession 3 of the Town of Richmond Hill (formerly Township of Whitchurch).

Pursuant to section 446 of The Municipal Act, the Engineering Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 2:00 p.m. on the 8th day of January 1980, at the Engineering Building on the west side of Woodbine Avenue one and one quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard is requested to advise the undersigned prior to the meeting. If any party entitled to be heard does not attend at the hearing, the Committee may proceed in his absence and he will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceedings.

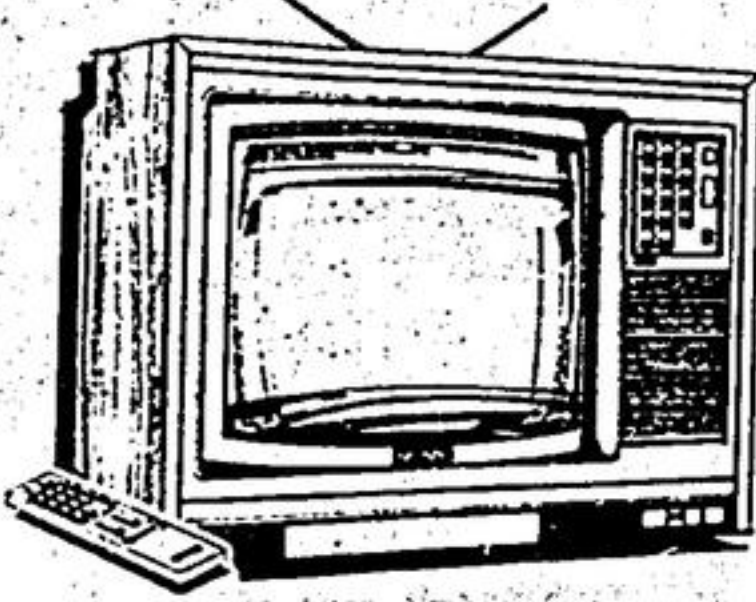

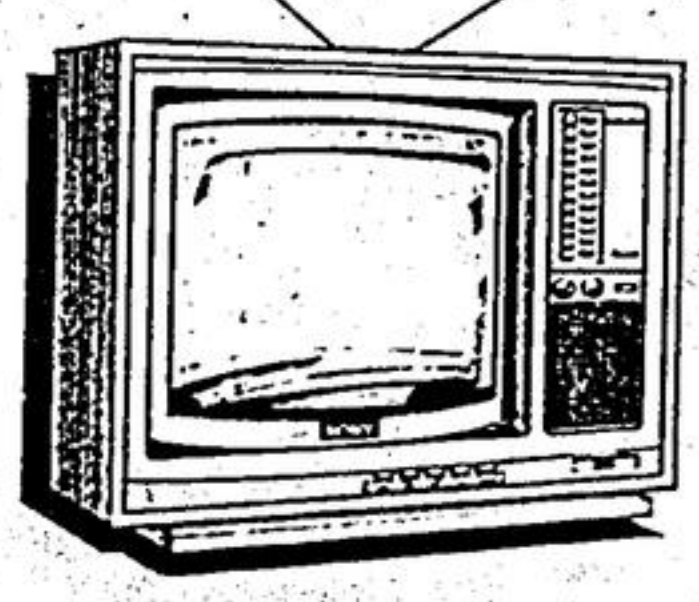

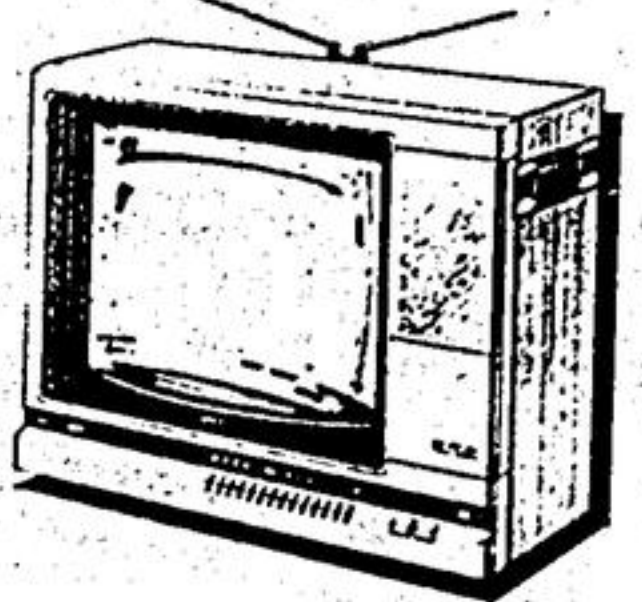
