Oppose resort bar

The first application made to the Liquor Licence Board of Ontario (LCBO) Oct. 15 was for the serving of liquor in the dining lounge during the Dagmar Ski Resort.

But Ward one councillor John Paxton said he is strongly against the establishment of a permanent bar at the site because of its proximity to Regional Road 23. "There's bound to be plenty of accidents when there are too many vehicles going on and coming off the road," he said. He said if it was a golf or country club, where only members are admitted, it might be "a different story." He recommended that council petition the LCBO with its concerns.

Paxton noted that many residents also objected to a bar in the heart of a public ski resort, and said "we're here to see that their concerns are dealt with." "Before you know it, there will be rock concerts there. I personally would like to see a large restaurant facility because the town is lacking that type of accommodation. Passed: was the recommendation to authorize clerk, Walter Taylor to attend hearings and make council's objections known."
