**STOUFFVILLE** — In one of the fastest junior hockey division games this season, East End Gulf tied Tolton 3-3.

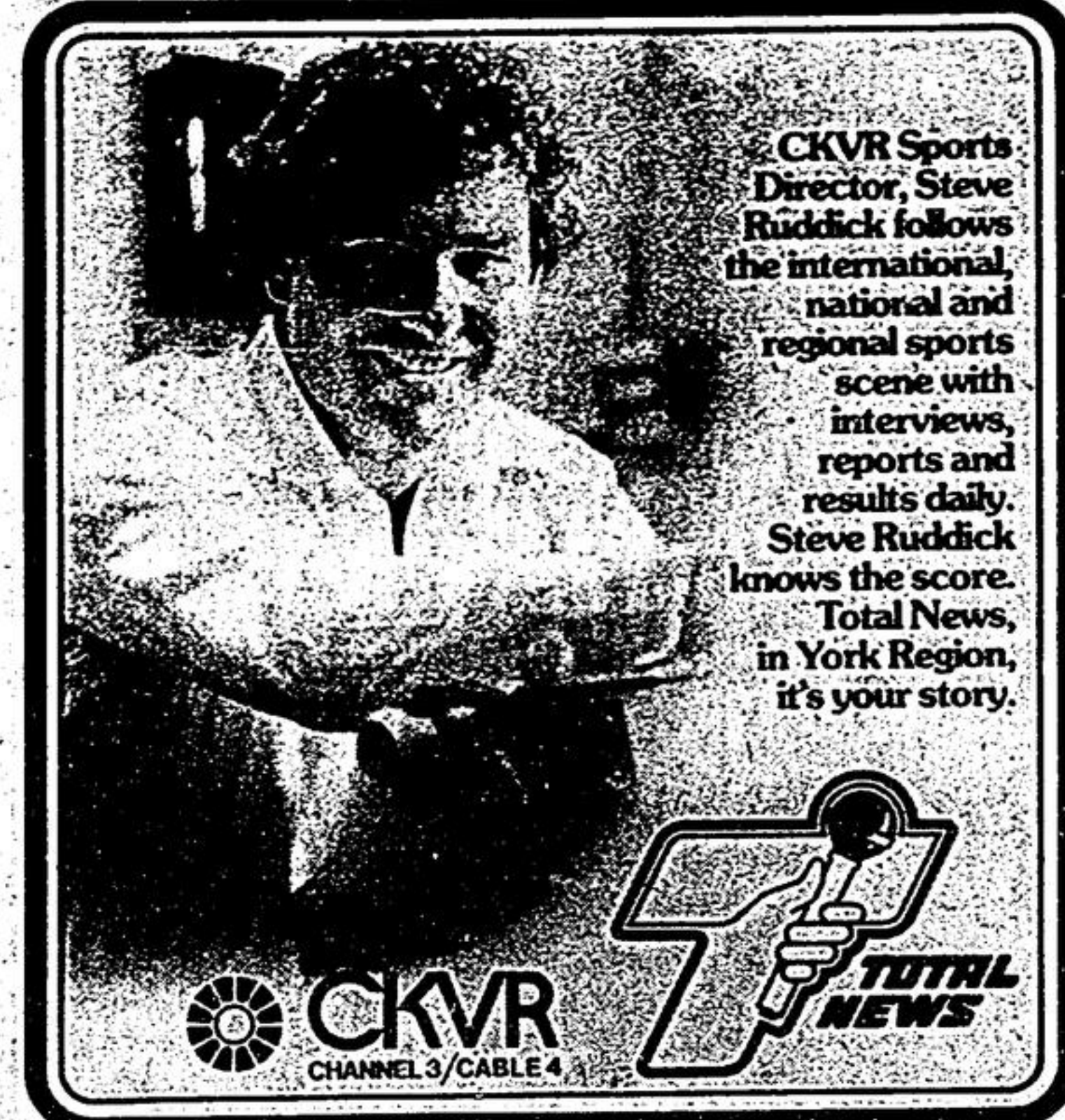
wards put Tolton on the board with a pass from Dale Leger. Tolton tied it 2-2 late in the period with an unassisted effort by Robert Brooks.
