## Business is booming

## Beauty treatment for refined dogs

STOUFFVILLE — If you want your dog to look well groomed then Paula Nicholson is the person to see.

Mrs. Nicholson has started her own dog-clipping business which she operates at her own apartment in Success Square. And so far it's been very successful.

She picked up this skill at previous jobs. She worked at the House of Poodles and the House of Puppies both on Bayview Avenue. Even after leaving these positions she kept in practise by

clipping her friends' dogs and her own two poodles 'Jay' and 'Pebbles.'

"I've been doing this for a long time but I never advertised," Mrs. Nicholson said.

In September, she decided to launch the business on her own. She posted advertisements in grocery stores and at Beckers. The response was overwhelming.

"I've already done 52 dogs," she said. "Most people I've dealt with have come back a second time and I'm always getting new customers."

Her husband Brian,

just like a hairdresser," she said.

Mrs. Nicholson said that she hasn't encountered too many problems handling the dogs so far.

"The hardest part is to get them to stand still. Very few will just stand there. It takes a lot of patience," she said.

Presently, Mrs.

Nicholson said she prefers doing only one dog a day because of the amount of time involved. She usually sets up her appointments for 10 a.m. but she will do a dog in the evening if the person is unable to come in the morning.

She will do any type of dog and it doesn't have to be for the whole treatment. If a customer only wants the pet bathed, she'll do that too.

Mrs. Nicholson said the average poodle should be clipped once every two months. For any other type of dog it's up to the discretion of the owner.

She charges \$13 for the complete treatment if it's a small dog and \$10 for just a bath and blow-dry.

Mrs. Nicholson said she was thinking of opening a store with more space so she could do larger dogs. "But I don't know how it would go over. I don't know if there really is that kind of need."

What Mrs. Nicholson really hopes for in the future is to operate a boarding kennel and do clipping on the side.

Until then, she's content to go on clipping at home.
