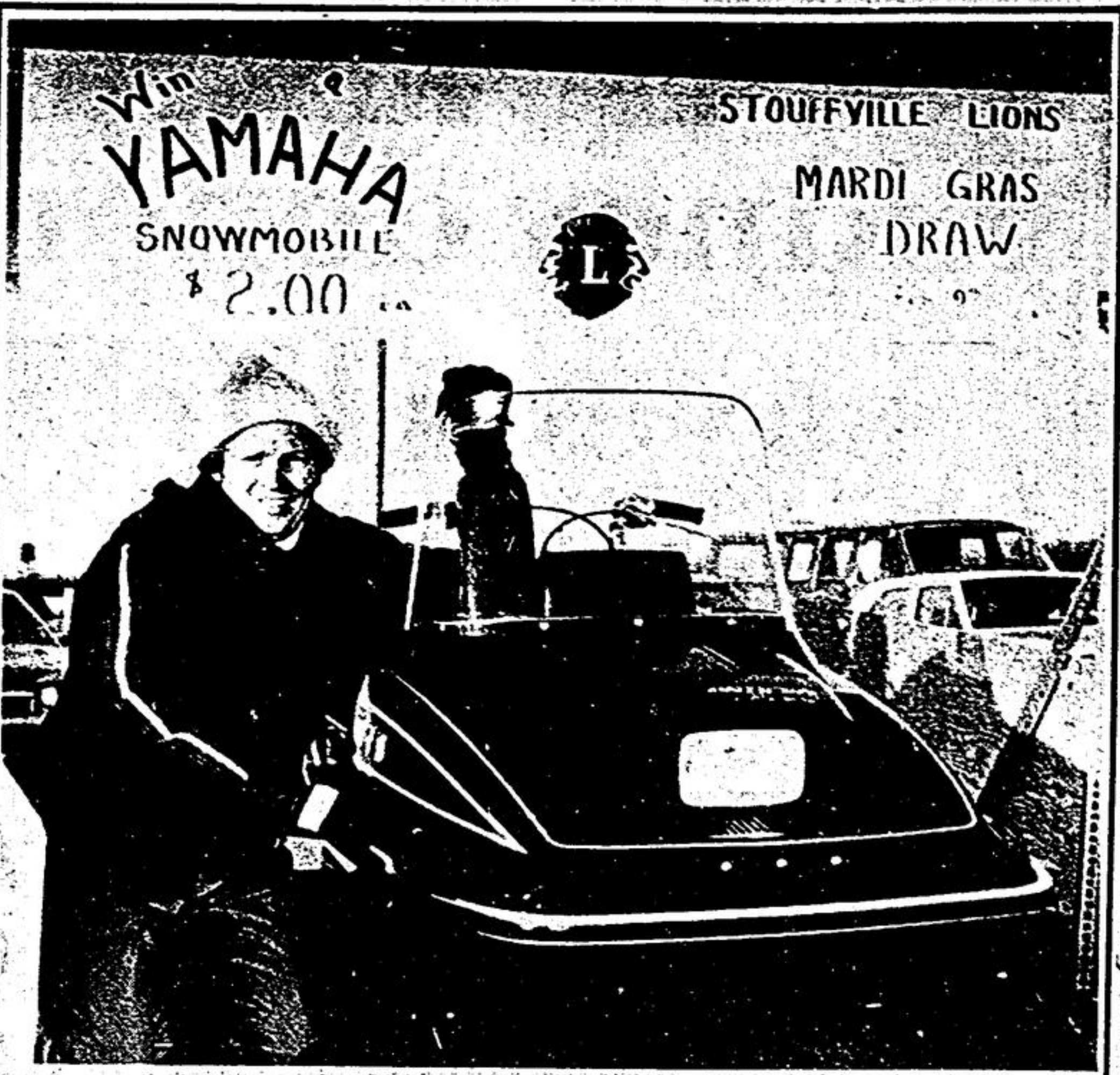

Business is booming

Beauty treatment for refined dogs

By Lyne Couturier STOUFFVILLE — If you want your dog to look well groomed then Paula Nicholson is the person to see.

Mrs. Nicholson has started her own dog-clipping business, which she operates at her own apartment in Success Square. And so far it's been very successful.

She picked up this skill at previous jobs. She worked at the House of Poodles and the House of Puppies both on Bayview Avenue. Even after leaving these positions she kept in practise by

clipping her friends' dogs and her own two poodles 'Jay' and 'Pebbles.'

"I've been doing this for a long time but I never advertised," Mrs. Nicholson said.

In September, she decided to launch the business on her own. She posted advertisements in grocery stores and at Beckers. The response was overwhelming.

"I've already done 52 dogs," she said. "Most people I've dealt with have come back a second time and I'm always getting new customers."

Photo display breathtaking

converted the laundry room which extends from the kitchen into a workshop with a table on which to place the dogs and tub to wash them in.

Mrs. Nicholson said she prefers doing little dogs because the room and the wash basin are limited in size.

Grooming a dog is not an easy task and takes as much time and effort as a woman receiving a beauty treatment at a salon.

On the average, it takes three hours to groom a dog and there are a lot of steps involved. First, the dog must be brushed thoroughly to remove any knots and tangles in the hair. Once this is done the clipping can start.

The next step is to bathe the animal then a complete blow-dry. Mrs. Nicholson uses a vacuum.

"I started by using a blow-dryer but it was too hot and I could tell that it bothered the dogs," she said.

She says a vacuum cleaner is more useful because it has more power and it dries the dog's coat faster. It also remains at the same temperature and never gets hot.

Once the pet is completely dry, its nails are clipped and its ears are cleaned. Then comes the finale, the fine scissoring. Mrs. Nicholson says this is the most difficult part because you go over the dog's hair making sure that it's all one length.

"This takes a long time. You have to style it
