### Show

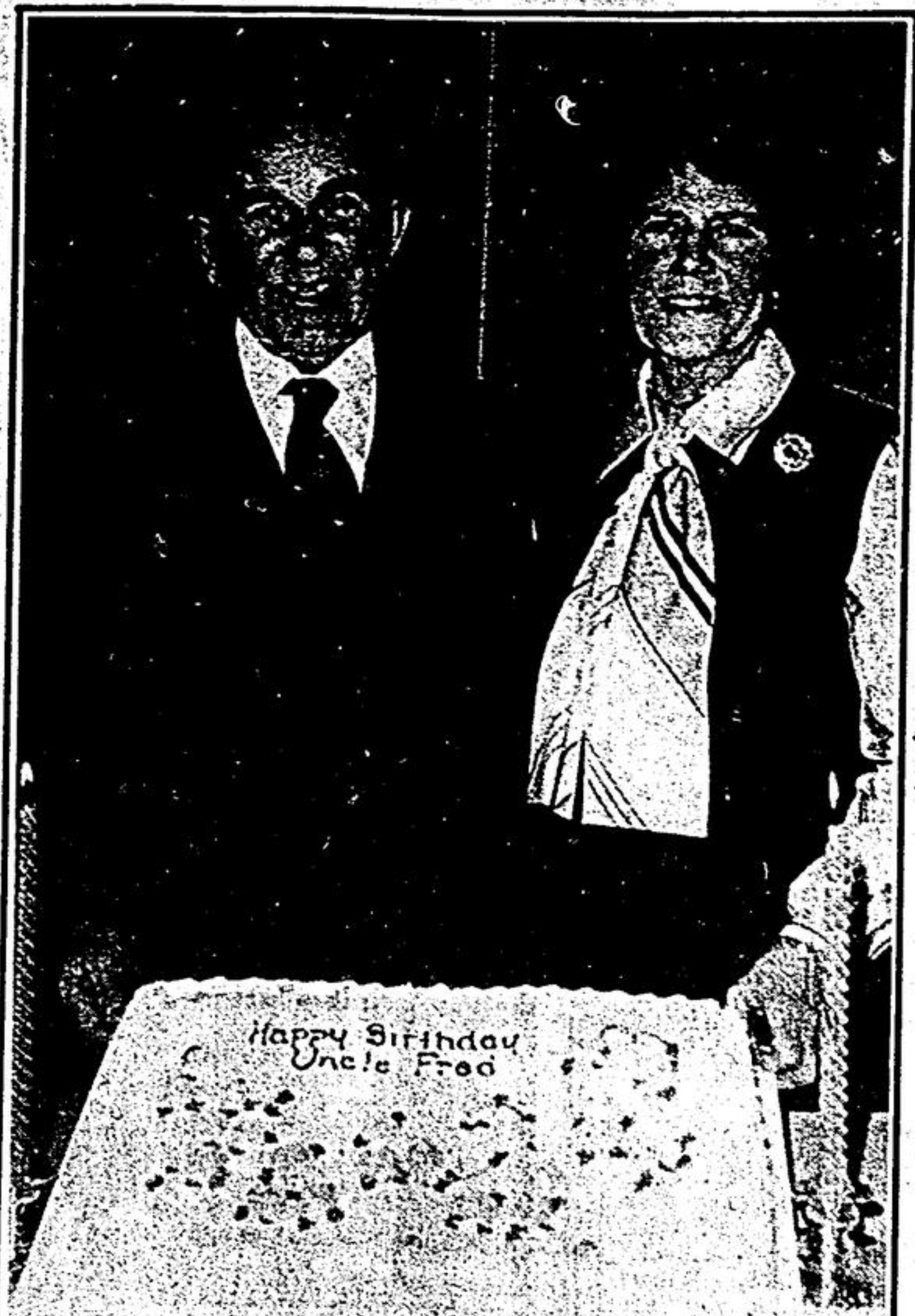

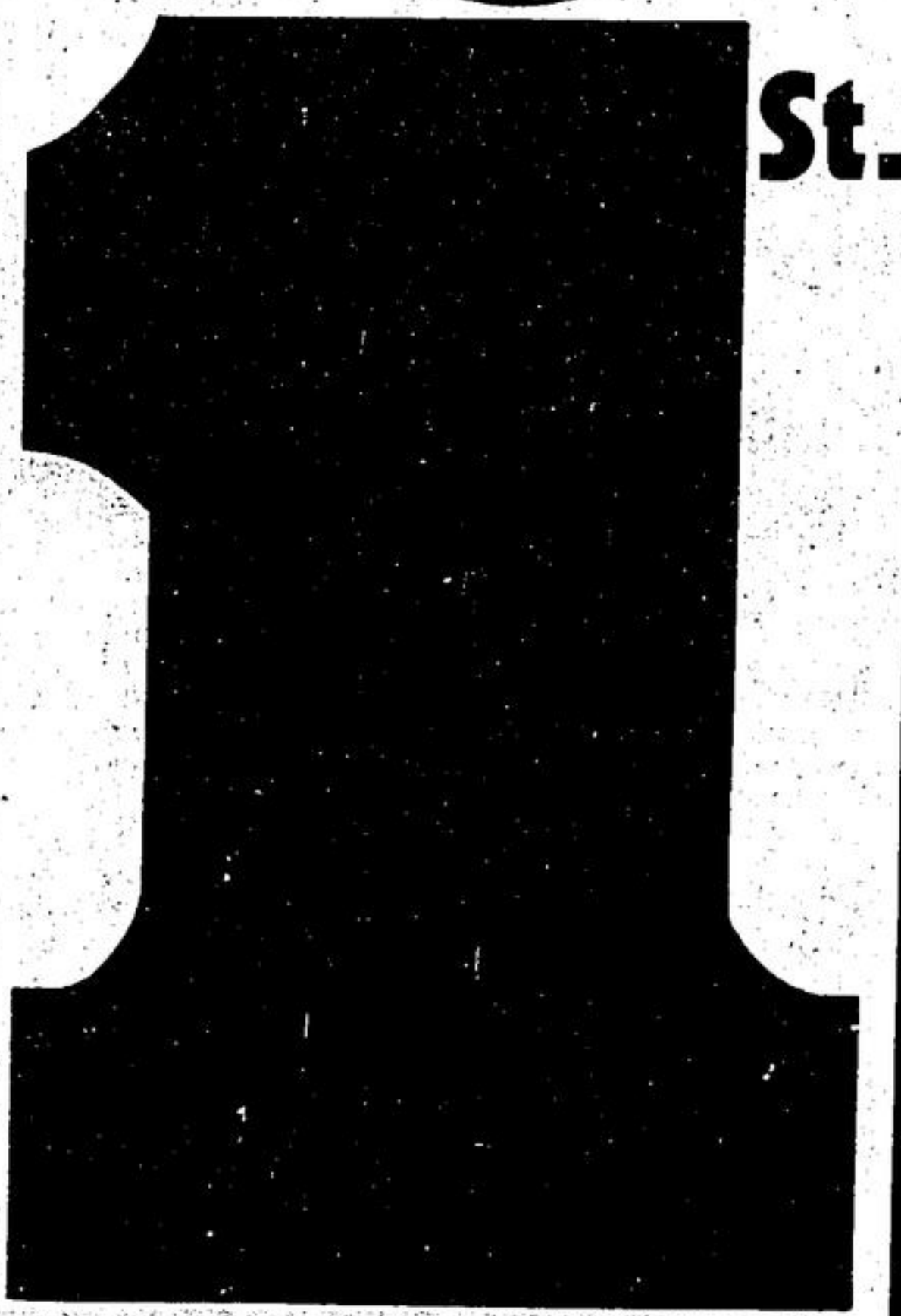


### Honored on his 80th birthday
